This month in Reading, our students will continue learning about characters and events to better understand perspective. And in writing we are working on how to write a Narrative Journal Entry, including reading the prompt and using a checklist.

In Math, we will continue to improve our knowledge of multiplication facts, patterning and arrays.

Third graders should log on to i-Ready nightly to support their growth in Reading and Math. The goal is to earn a passing score of 70% or better on each lesson. Twelve passing scores will earn your child points towards the Green Party! This program has a strong correlation to FSA performance!

As you may have noticed, our Campus Beautification is in full swing! There will be a flyer sent home shortly inviting all students and their families to come out and join us for a morning of service. All supplies will be on hand ~ including water bottles, latex gloves, live plants, and seeds as well as tools to help beautify our school grounds and we hope to see you then!

FOURTH GRADE

Hey Fourth Grade, CCES Families! We hope everyone is doing well, and happy holidays!

Here's a glance at what we are working on:Reading- We are focusing on understanding different points of view for Unit 4.

• Math- We are currently on Chapter 5, Factors, Multiples, and Patterns. Please remember to have students study their multiplication facts daily, as this is a huge success factor for 4th and 5th-grade students.

• Social Studies- We are learning about our state's history.

• Science- We are comparing and contrasting the major stages in the life cycles of Florida's plants and animals.

• iReady- Students must pass 2 reading and 2 math lessons at 70% or higher every week to attend the Green Party.

We are now visiting our science lab weekly to conduct experiments and activities based on our science standards. We are finishing "Forms and Uses of Energy" and will be learning about "Atomic Theory" next.

For the month of December, our students will continue working in our new reading series-Benchmark Advance. We have completed Unit 3 "The U.S Constitution: Then and Now" and we have now started Unit 4: "Author's Point of View."

We continue incorporating reading/writing, science, and social studies topics into our new reading series. Students are taking the reading books associated with our new reading series home when we are finished with them. They can work on comprehension and fluency skills and build their own home library!

Continue to work on multiplication tables daily and review multiplication of decimals as we move on to division of decimals in chapter 5 of our Go Math book.

We have been working with Officer Dan the last several weeks on our D.A.R.E. program. The students are learning a lot and enjoying the discussion topics.


AUTISM SPECIAL PROGRAM



ATTENDANCE MATTERS

This line is open 24 hours/ 7 days a week for your convenience. Absence excusals must be received within 48 hours of the absence.

Your child's attendance is important to us here at CCES! The Broward Truancy Intervention Program (BTIP) program is designed to prevent excessive absences through parent notification and accountability, school interventions and daily monitoring of attendance. Parents who do not comply are referred to the State Attorney's Office for failure to comply with Florida Status 1003.27 which provides that a parent commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided by law, if the parent refuses or fails to have a child attend school regularly or refuses to participate in meetings concerning the child's truancy.


