

Welcome to the School Counselor's Corner



First Grade News:


Happy January! We will be learning about magnifiers and how they make things appear larger. We are also learning about primary sources in social studies. Students will compare life in the past and life now.



CAPTAIN BARRINGTON IRVING

Captain Barrington Irving loves exploring, inspiring, and teaching. At 23, he became the youngest and first black pilot to fly solo around the world. Cpt. Barrington has conducted over 30 STEM expeditions around the world. He founded the Flying Classroom, a K-8 STEM+ digital curriculum, in 2014. Experience Aviation, his nonprofit, provides hands-on STEM programs and career guidance to middle and high school students in several states. Cpt. Barrington received a Congressional Resolution and was named a National Geographic Emerging Explorer in


