We're excited to kick off November with a focus on two important aspects of our students' growth – Resilience and Citizenship!

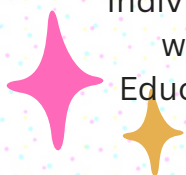
Life Skills & Wellness Theme: Resiliency

LITERACY NOOK WITH MICHELE ROTHACKER



We are in our second quarter of school and of course we are continuing to develop on our literacy skills. Those skills include oral language, phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, comprehension and writing. Our students are working on Unit 3 of Benchmark Advance which focuses on the topic of Government and Citizenship.

November brings our first BLAST Night of the school year. BLAST is what we call our family nights and this one is focusing on reading! We hope to see you on Thursday, November 30 at 6:00 pm! We will also have a representative from the New Worlds Reading Initiative. Students who qualify for this program can get free books delivered to their home!

We encourage reading of any kind! Here are some tips to help develop your child's love of reading.

- Find out what your child is interested in and get texts related to that topic. These can be books, graphic novels, magazines, or online digital texts. The public library, as well as our school library, have plenty of options to choose from.
- When choosing a text, it is okay if your child picks one a little easier or more difficult than their actual level. When interested in a topic, they're more likely to engage with a challenging text on that topic. A text that's difficult will provide an opportunity for reading with a family member.

As December approaches, please make a note of important testing dates. Students will be taking the PM2 of the Florida FAST. We are excited to see the progress they have made from PM1. Please make sure your child is well rested and arrives on time to school on the following dates.

- Grades 3 & 5 ELA & Math - December 4 & 5
- Grade 4 ELA & Math - December 6 & 7
- Grades K-2 ELA & Math - December 11 & 12



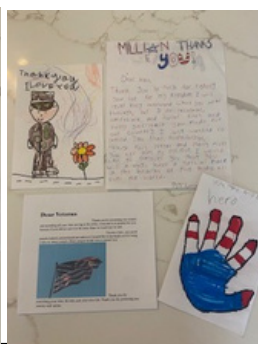
SOCIAL STUDIES

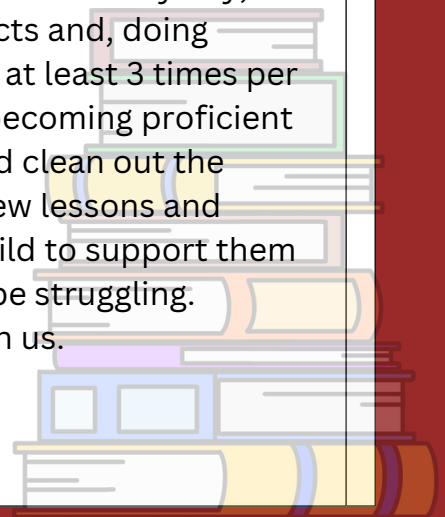

THIRD GRADE

Greetings from the Third Grade Team, We are wrapping up Unit 3, in ELA, Government for the People. Our Essential Question is: Why do people participate in government? We are finishing Topic 5 in Math, Quadrilaterals, Area, and Perimeter. Our next topic in math is Topic 6: Place Value-Numbers to 10,000. In Science, we are learning about Seasonal Adaptions. What structures in animals and what behaviors of animals allow them to survive changing seasons and how plants respond to seasonal changes. Our current Social Studies focus is Hispanic Heritage, Veteran's Recognition, Caribbean Heritage, and Human Rights. Parents, your student must have headphones to complete computer assignments at school. Please send in headphones for students to leave in their desks. It is also particularly important for students to work on iReady Reading and Math and complete lessons at home.

Your partnership is vital to your child's success. Supporting our students with homework, reading 20 minutes every day, learning multiplication facts and, doing iReady Reading and Math at least 3 times per week, will assist them in becoming proficient learners. Please check and clean out the Green Folders daily. Review lessons and assignments with your child to support them in areas where they may be struggling. Thanks for partnering with us.

FOURTH GRADE & FIFTH GRADE

FOURTH GRADE

Hello Fourth Grade Families!

We are busy learning in fourth grade! We just finished Unit 3 in Reading and will focus on the government and how it affects our lives. Students will learn to apply various comprehension skills, such as identifying important and unimportant information, examining the text structure and features, summarizing, using context clues, and making inferences. In writing, we will be focusing on text-based informative essays.

In Math, we will be focusing on developing an understanding of finding whole-number quotients and remainders with up to four-digit dividends and 1-digit divisors. Your child will use methods based on place value, the properties of operations, and/or the relationship between multiplication and division. The next topic focuses on solving word problems using previously learned skills for adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing multi-digit whole numbers. This topic focuses on using multiplication to solve comparison problems.

Your child will draw on an understanding of the four operations and use bar diagrams to represent the problem situations.

FOURTH GRADE continued

In Science, we will be learning about magnets, changing the properties of matter, and the properties of water. In Social Studies, students will focus on the settlement of Florida. Key points we will focus on are St. Augustine, Fort Moise, Seminoles, the effects of Spanish rule, and other nations who controlled Florida. Students will also explore the impact of technological advances on Florida. They will also examine what pioneer life was like in Florida for different groups of people. We want every student to attend the PAW Party! Students must have eight Reading and Math lessons passed at 67% or higher. Students can log in at home to work on lessons.

Students receive Reading, Math, and Spelling homework each week. Please make sure you are checking their homework and reviewing the concepts with them at home.

Hello Parents and Guardians,

In Science, we are finishing up human organs and body systems and will be learning about chemical and physical changes next. Science

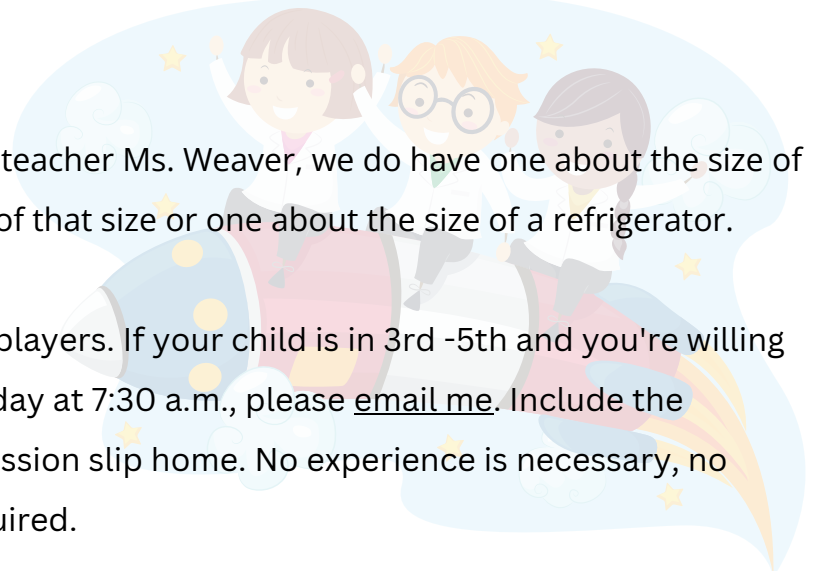

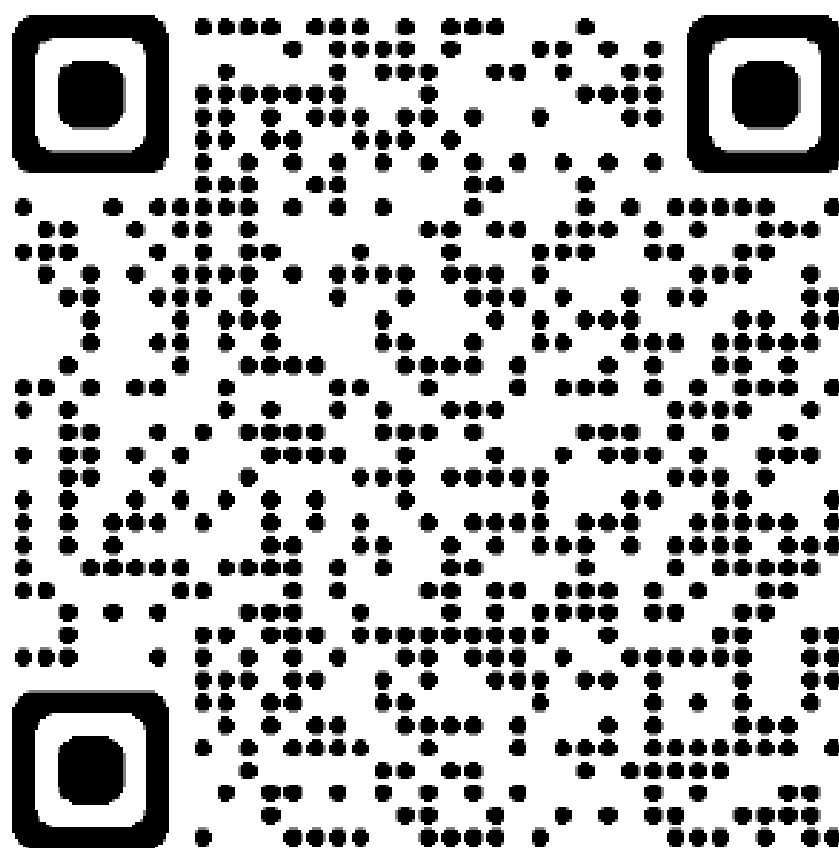
