Broward Schools has transitioned to the Plain Language Emergency protocol. This language will be used to conduct our monthly safety drills and in the event of an emergency.



# Welcome to the School Counselor's Corner



#### October Kids of Character: Responsibility

Your child's belief in his or her ability to learn has a greater impact on academic success than his or her intelligence. Helping children develop a growth mindset positions them on a path to success. We are learning about the importance of curiosity to help our brains grow and learn.

We are learning that it's smart to ask questions and that we should not feel embarrassed to ask questions because it helps us learn more. We are also learning that we can learn a lot through reading, playing, watching, and listening to others.

Here are some activities that you can do with your child at home to help with Growth Mindset:

 Have your child interview you about your job/career. Record the interview and let your child listen to it. Later, ask your child what he or she learned about your job/career.

2. Take your child to a zoo or museum and encourage him or her to ask questions of the people working there. Talk about what your child learned afterwards.

3. Do a book club with your child where you both read the same book. Each day, take turns asking each other questions and discussing the book.

Be patient and answer your child's questions. Children sometimes stop asking questions because they feel like it makes them not look smart. The opposite is true – smart people ask questions so encourage your child to ask away!

Fall has arrived and we are "falling" into our groove with mathematics instruction at CCES! Teachers have guided students through topics 1-3 at this point, and students will be taking their Cumulative Topics 1-3 assessment at the beginning of this month. Your student's teacher will share with you directly regarding your student's specific testing date. We are excited to review this data and see all the content that our students have learned during the first two months of school. A handful of our teachers participated in professional development to dive deep into the implementation (the "how to") process of our math curriculum, Savvas Realize.

With this new information and lots of practical ideas, I know our math instruction school-wide will benefit from these innovative ideas. We will be working with our beginning-of-the-year data from Savvas Realize, FAST PM1(STAR math), and iReady to create a path forward recognizing individual needs in order to provide quality math instruction for each of our students. We appreciate your support in math and hope to build a powerful partnership with our families this year!

#### Ideas for supporting math at home:

- (1) Grocery shop—give them a little list and let them "budget" how much money is needed for their purchase or allow them to count how many items you purchased as each item is placed on the conveyor belt at check out.
- (2) Cook Together—Follow a recipe card or picture cues and instructions printed on the back of various food items. Let them measure, double a recipe, set the timer, figure out how long dinner will take to prep, etc.
- (3) Traffic Light Race—Build fact fluency (addition/subtraction or multiplication/division) with a set of flashcards in the car. See how many facts your student can get right before the light turns green.

# READING

### LITERACY NOOK WITH MICHELE ROTHACKER



We are working hard, learning so much and having fun as we work on our literacy skills. Unit 1 of Benchmark Advance has focused on the topic of Life Science. All grade levels will be taking their first Unit Assessment within the next week or so. Unit 2 of Benchmark Advance topic is Character Matters. We will focus on book characters, how they change and how they respond to certain actions.

As mentioned last month, our school is engaged in the Science of Reading. Following are the components we are focusing on with a brief description.

#### Oral Language:

The spoken language used to express knowledge, ideas, and feelings. We encourage you to ask questions of your child where they need to give more than a yes or no answer.

#### Phonological Awareness:

The ability to manipulate phonemes within words by isolating sounds and blending them. Say a word like "bat" and ask your child what letter it starts with, what sound it starts with, and what is a word that rhymes with it.

#### Phonics:

The relationship between phonemes and printed letters and the use of this knowledge to read and spell.

#### Vocabulary:

The knowledge of words and their meanings.

#### Writing:

The ability to communicate knowledge, ideas, and feelings in written form.

#### Comprehension:

The ability to extract and construct meaning from text.

#### **October**

This month is when we highlight and celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. Our teachers have already begun and will continue to showcase and engage students in meaningful, collaborative learning experiences for Hispanic Heritage Month which runs through October 15th. #### **THIRD GRADE**


Greetings from the Third Grade Team,


