
PURPOSE FOR MONTHLY TOWN HALL MEETINGS







Promotion Requirements

Promotion from 6th to 7th and 7th to 8th Grades:

•A student must pass a minimum of four courses, two of which must be in English, mathematics, science, or social studies.

•Promotion from 8th to 9th Grade:

- •The student must successfully complete the following courses:
 - Three middle grades or higher courses in English Language Arts
 - Three middle grades or higher courses in mathematics
 - Three middle grades or higher courses in social studies, one of these courses must be at least a one-semester civics education course
 - Three middle grades or higher courses in science
 - Student must complete a Career & Education Planning course







Band 1: Beginning Band

In Beginning Band, following the completion of our instrument fitting process, we will start students on the following instruments: flute, clarinet, trumpet, and trombone. Some students come to the program with previous experience, most do not. We start the year with all students on the same curriculum and allow students to differentiate as we progress through the year. All students complete our *Pass-offs* performance project but can complete the project at their own rate. Accelerated students can participate in our Symphonic Band through audition. Students needing more experience will move towards our Concert Band.

Band 2: Concert Band

In Concert Band, the majority of the group is in 7th grade. We start the year with reviewing the most important skills from Beginning Band, then progress through Level 1 and 2 pass-offs and the Essential Elements Book 1. All students can progress through the curriculum at their own pace through the year. At this level, it is important for students to begin relying on their own musicianship to progress and might acquire additional support from director. All students complete our Pass-offs performance project but can complete the project at their own rate. Accelerated students can audition for the All-County Band and All-State Band in the fall and participate in the FBA Solo & Ensemble Festival in the Spring.
