We just finished PM2, primary tested before the break and the intermediate grades tested when they came back from break. A lot of kids were absent so there were a lot of make up testing.

Projected proficiency based on Iready 5th grade 68% proficient with an overall proficiency of 62%. According to data, if we continue in the same path, we are projected to maintain our A score.

We have tutoring groups to help the kids who need a bit of a push to move up. We have 11 teachers in the program, and we are at full capacity. The focus for the school this year is to be a stronger A. We have a plan of incentives to push our students to complete Iready. Ufil Phonics instruction. Next year, Tropical will be considered a Ufil school because we will all be working on phonics using this program. Teachers will be receiving training on this. We are very excited about this program coming to our school.

Black History Month is in February and lots of things will be coming up in the classroom, media center etc.

Testing is upcoming PIE graph was shown regarding validation throughout the state of Florida-technology like cell phones and glasses that are techy if a student is caught with a phone, smart watch, smart glasses will have test invalidated no matter what. Testing dates 1-2 April; K-March; 3,4,5 May. Then alternative testing immediately afterwards. Ask teachers to contact parents to make sure that parents get notified about testing and to mention how important it is to be present on testing dates. Ms Khan asked if there will ever be a limited time frame for testing. Ms Chrystie stated that there is no time limit. Students can take all day long if they need it. For the writing test, however, there is a three hour limit. If a child has to go home during the test because they feel ill in the middle of the test, test administrators are able to reopen a test on the next day or when they come better. However, if they go home just because or they have a doctor's appointment they cannot complete the test. Teachers are asked to check their students' eyes, i.e., to make sure that they are not sick. Ms Khan suggested that parents be notified of all future test dates. Ms Chrystie, Mr. Schneider, and Mr. Gorde all agreed.
- 11. Ms Villases has an update for ELL community (114) students. She started testing in January and should be done by the deadline of March 14. Will look at data to determine how proficient they are with their language acquisition.
- 12. Title I Review what we have done and Plans for Next Year: Susan Antunez

TITLE 1 - Susan Antunez, Liaison

We must close out some Title 1 documents. Although we do not yet know if we are Title One for next school year, we need to prepare next year's Title 1 documents in advance per the requirements.

- 1. Review Title 1 Survey results
 - Mrs. Antunez, Title One Liaison showed the survey results on the screen. Stakeholders in attendance were given many opportunities to comment or ask questions during this presentation. Reviewed questions that had the most negative responses.
 - "I often receive info about whether my student moves on to the next grade or not 12 people disagree. Ms Kahn says that usually this is being spoken about in third grade. Mr Gorde states that he believes that parents are expected to be more hands on regarding their child. Teachers should be contacting parents before the EOY regarding retaining them in same grade level.
- Review 2024/2025 and Develop School Parent Compact
 The parents and staff had the opportunity to view this year's compact, ask questions, and give feedback. Mr. Gorde states that the compact is very clear. Mrs. Khan stated that the compact was clear and concise, and no revisions were recommended.
- 3. Review 2023/2024 and Develop 2025/2026 School Level Parent and Family Engagement Plan

This year's PFEP was reviewed. We discussed the turnout of each of the family nights. Mrs. Khan and Mr. Gorde said that they could not attend because of schedule conflict, but that they heard very good things about it. Everyone loved STEM night, they suggested that we do it again next year.

Mrs. Antunez suggested we could do a literacy night at Barnes and Noble. Mrs. Khan loved this idea and said it would be a great activity off campus. Ms. Blinsky said she's been to these events at the bookstore and they are wonderful. Ms. Thomas suggested we do a math family activity at Publix or Target. We could ask about Saturday. We will reach out to Target and Publix (Target on Griffin and Stirling was suggested because of parking)

4. Develop 2025/2026 School Improvement Plan and Title 1 Addendum

TITLE 1 PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT ALLOCATION BUDGET

Reviewed where our funds are allocated this year, \$500 for MODS outreach and 2 interventionists— Mrs. Antunez suggested to increase the budget to possibly \$700 because this year they increased their price and we were \$50 short in budget. Mr. Gorde suggested that we ask MODS to let us use the money as we feel it would work best. Dr. Green agreed that we should continue funding two interventionist on Title 1 budget plan going for next year. Ms. Thomas suggested that we add an interventionist to see students in the "bubble" who are in 2nd grade. Ms Khan stated that she is concerned about the "bubble kids" because she feels that they are not necessarily looked at.

- 13. Principal Updates Next meeting on April 2 (Wednesday) Mr. Schneider praised Ms Villases and Ms Belinski Kelly services handles our substitutes sees extra funding therefore is able to put an extra monitor in classrooms for more support. To help teachers and students with classroom instruction. Should push us up to earn an A+. Schneider is proud of the incentives in place for iReady instruction. Everyone gets awarded. Feels that it is working. Every two weeks the prices are changed. Last week it was donuts and next week will be ice cream. Same technique will be done with science. Very exciting. Ms Thomas and Berryman are still waiting for their teacher prices. DHH system-display panels might not still be where they should be. Testing will begin on Wednesday, March 5th. Currently, DHH is functioning with two systems. Apparently itinerants were not able to hear the system, hence, a trial must be done. Last week we had a "secure" system to test the panels because several people said that they could not hear the system in hallways. He will make sure that everyone understands why a code will occur. Places in the school that the new system is not working appropriately will be updated. School social worker week, March 3-7 appreciation week. Spring Break ends on March 31 because it is Ramadan Day. Calendar is working smoothly. Mr. Schneider and Dr. Brown are very proud of their staff and students.
