

Students, who receive an "F" in any class, MUST receive passing grades for both the 4th Nine Weeks and the FINAL Exam to receive the .5 semester credit for the course. Keep in mind, Graduation, Dual Enrollment, athletics, and student activities have minimum GPA requirements for participation. Competition for available scholarships also relies on strong academic performance and GPAs. Once a GPA drops below 2.0 it is very difficult to bring it up. Don't get caught in the cycle of poor grades and the resulting need for credit recovery and night school. Attendance in class is key. Be on time. Stay focused. Work hard. Check your Pinnacle regularly! Keep up with class work and challenge yourself to raise the bar for success. You are building your transcript with each set of nine- week grades.
