

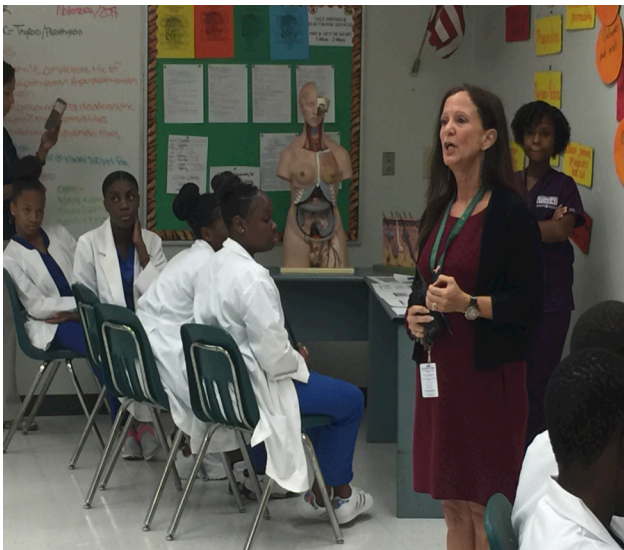

We would like to thank everyone for helping William Dandy feel welcome during their visit, especially the wonderful folks in the cafeteria!

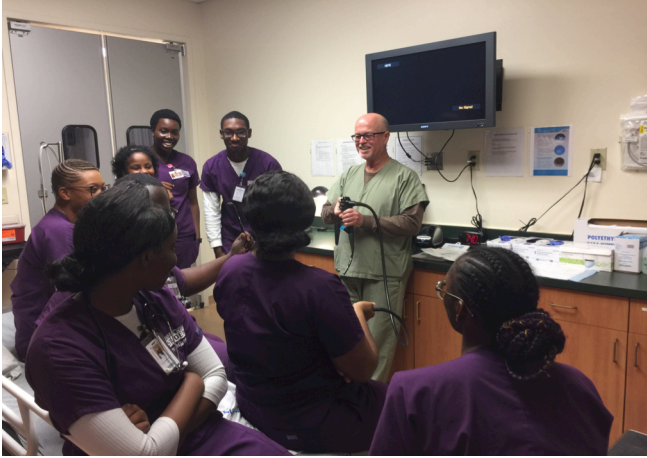
Blood and platelets cannot be manufactured in a lab. Considering that someone requires a blood transfusion every two seconds, community donations are significantly important.
