Sensational Second Grade

We are working hard to master all our second grade standards for the year and preparing for the end-of year reading and math assessments. During reading our second graders have been learning about the characters' point of view, connecting words and images, and comparing and contrasting two texts. We continue to practice our writing skills with informative writing.
