Welcome

Thank you for coming out to our 2018-2019 Parent Magnet High School Information Night. This evening is designed to give you the peace of mind when deciding and applying to Magnet High Schools for your child. We know this can be pressure filled process, but Silver Lakes stands ready to help you navigate your options and aid you in deciding and applying.

Magnet Application Timeline

The application window opens on December 1st of this year and continues through February 6th, 2019. During this application period, students are free to research, communicate with, and visit the various Magnet High Schools. Applications can <u>only</u> be submitted online during this period. Students and Parents will have access to their application during this period to edit personal information and to change school selections. When the Magnet Application Window closes, the application is submitted for consideration and cannot be changed. Formal letters of acceptance are usually sent out in March. Parents then have around two weeks to claim the Magnet seat at the school and register their child. If the seat is not claimed within the required time frame, the seat will be given to the next candidate or a wait-listed candidate.

How to Choose an Appropriate Magnet Program

Parents and students have a wide variety of Magnet High schools to choose from. The best way to look at Magnet High School selection is to liken it to a big-ticket purchase, like a car. First, are you **eligible** to get financing for car? Next, if you are eligible, **research** what is out there for purchase. Then, after you have figured out what you want, **visit** the dealership to get more information. Finally, before you make your decision, **test drive** the car before you sign on the dotted line. These steps are a great guide for choosing a high school.

• Eligibility

To be eligible for the bulk of the Magnet High School offerings, students must have a 2.5 unweighted GPA and a 3.0 FSA Score in ELA and Mathematics. High Schools look at 7th grade FSA scores when determining eligibility. Some programs, like the Latin School, Cambridge, or International Baccalaureate programs require a higher GPA and/or FSA score.

• Research

By attending this information session, you have already taken the first steps in gathering information on high school magnet options. Follow-up tonight's introduction with online research on the high school's website and the district's Innovative Programs website (https://www.browardschools.com/Page/36412). This is a great one-stop shop for information and updates to the district's offerings, at all grade levels, including links to schools, themes, promotional materials, and, starting December 1st, the Magnet Application itself.

• Visit

Every Magnet High School will host an Open House Night in the next three months where parents and students will have an opportunity to meet with faculty and current students, tour the campus and its facilities, and see what students are doing in the program itself. This is also a great opportunity to get more detailed information on practical considerations like transportation, after-school activities and clubs, school hours, and the like.

• Test Drive

If you are seriously considering a High School Magnet Program – test drive it. Almost every school will offer a "shadow" experience where interested students can spend a day on campus seeing what a magnet student's day is like. This is not only a great opportunity to see what the magnet classes cover, but it can also give your student a feel for the campus environment.
