TEQUESTA TRACE MIDDLE SCHOOL 6TH GRADE COURSE CARD 2025 - 2026



Sixth grade students take Language Arts, Math, Seience, and World History. Students will be placed in the highest, most rigorous courses available based on their previous FSA scores/F.A.S.T. PM 3 scores and their teacher recommendations. Unless F.A.S.T. scores necessitate a Rending class, students will be scheduled for 4 elective classes. Students need to choose 6 elective classes in order of preference: 1", 2", 3", 4", and 5" choice. Students need to relect 1" place for a literacy course. See box below. Please consider your choices carefully. Every effort will be made to grant students their choices, however, a student's request for a specific elective is not guaranteed. 
The Science of Reading

- Help them sound out each part and blend them together.


If your child struggles with sounding out words

- Understanding of multiple meanings, connotation, and denotation.


If your child struggles with vocabulary

- Share your experiences about the topic with your child.


FOCUS
