



All members stakeholders are provided opportunity to give input on academic and organizational decisions that impact student achievement and school safety and climate. The committee is also responsible for voting on specified school spending and budgetary decisions. On December 4, our member discussed the upcoming crunch time extended learning opportunities.

During this meeting, members suggested ways to streamline parent engagement and incentives for specific subgroups at Apollo. This year, Apollo has created several parent engagement nights that


