Dear Parent(s):

The United States Attorney's Office will be holding a virtual 75-minute Project Safe Childhood assembly for students at your child's school. Project Safe Childhood is a Department of Justice initiative launched in 2006, which aims to combat the proliferation of technology-facilitated exploitation crimes against children. The Department of Justice is committed to the safety and well-being of every child and has placed a high priority on combating exploitation of minors. Through a network of Federal, state and local law enforcement agencies and advocacy organizations, Project Safe Childhood coordinates efforts to protect our children by investigating and prosecuting online predators. Project Safe Childhood aims to teach children how to recognize and appropriately respond to deceptive behavior over the Internet. Cyberbullying happens when a young person uses a computer, cell phone, or other electronic device to torment, threaten, or harass another young person.

Parts of the presentation cover cyberbullying, child exploitation, bullying, Internet safety, and sexting. Please call or notify the school in writing if you do not want your child to attend the Project Safe Childhood assembly. No response to your child's school is an indication that you are consenting to your child attending the Project Safe Childhood assembly.
