

FSA Writes FAQ

- When does my student test?
 - 6th Grade A-L 4/6, M-Z 4/7
 - 7th Grade A-L 4/12, M-Z 4/13
 - 8th Grade A-L 4/14, M-Z 4/15
- Can I change the date of when my student tests?
 - No, students are grouped by last name to accommodate CDC guidelines
- Who is my student testing with and where?
 - First period teachers will inform the students of who they are testing with and the location. There will be school maps available for new students.
- Can I change who my student is testing with?
 - No, students are testing with a teacher that can accommodate CDC guidelines.
- What time is testing?
 - 9:10-12:15
- Where does my student go on test day?
 - Students should arrive prior to 9:10, gates open at 8:15.
 - 6th grade in gym, 7th grade in cafeteria, 8th grade in auditorium.
- What do they need to bring on test day?
 - Students need to wear a mask, bring a pencil, and if they are staying on campus all day they will need lunch and their computer. Students can also eat school lunch at no cost.
- Do they need an ID badge?
 - No, new students will get a temporary badge in their testing location.
- When can I pick up my student on test day?
 - When testing is over at 12:15, parent can sign out their student and they will be called out from their 4th period class. Students also have to option to stay on campus for the remainder of the school day.
- Will there be live teacher instruction on teams on test day?
 - No, during testing time 9-10-12:15, there will be NO live teacher instruction. Students do not need to log on to Teams during that time and teachers will be posting student led activities on Canvas. Live instruction will resume after testing has concluded.
- Can my student stay on campus if they are an elearner on test day?
 - Yes, students should bring their laptop and lunch if they are not eating a school lunch.
- Are the FSAs mandatory?
 - Technically yes, however they are not used for promotion in middle school.
- How can I opt-out my student?
 - There is NOT an opt-out policy for state testing in Florida. It is up to the parent to have their student attend school on test day. Students that are not on campus on test day will not test and students that are on campus on test day will be required to test.
- When is Make Up FSA Writes Testing?
 - Make up dates will be released after regular testing has concluded.
- When will the May dates be released?
 - The May FSA dates will be finalized and release by April 19
