## **Parking Rules and Guidelines**



Cooper City High School and the School Board of Broward County shall not be held responsible for damage to vehicles parked or operated on school property. School Board Policy #5307: "The Board shall not be responsible for damage to motor vehicles parked or operated on school property. All students who operate and park a motor vehicle at a school campus do so at their own risk."

You are to drive slow (5mph MAX) and exercise caution when driving on the campus of CCHS. All pedestrians have the right of way!

Parents & Student By signing your initials you are acknowledging that you have read and understand the expectations of our Please Initial Below: student drivers. Safety is a priority at CCHS and our expectations are high for all drivers. Student/ Parent The person registering the car at CCHS is the only person permitted to operate said vehicle on school grounds. Friends, classmates, or family members are NOT permitted to drive the permitted vehicle on campus, from 7:00am to 12:00pm. Vehicles operated on school grounds must be in safe operating condition. School personnel may deem vehicles unsafe. Only students with satisfactory behavior will be permitted to purchase and keep a student decal. If a student's behavior (Code of Conduct) becomes unsatisfactory after repeated violations the decal will be revoked. Suspensions, and/or repeated unsatisfactory behavior will result in loss of parking privileges. Leaving school without permission or your vehicle being used by others to break school rules (sneaking students off campus) will result in disciplinary actions including revocation of the Parking Permit. Student parking is restricted to the designated student parking lot. Students are expected to follow all traffic patterns and posted signage. You may not give permission to others to park in your parking spot when you are absent. Students may ONLY park in their designated spot. . A students' decal will be revoked for parking in unauthorized parking areas, such as; staff spots, Handicap spots, other student spots, vacant parking spots, fire lanes, and/or double parking. Student vehicles on campus are subject to search for reasonable suspicion. Weapons, drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, lighters, and other contraband outlined by the Code of Conduct are not permitted on campus at any time. The display of offensive flags, bumper stickers, words, or other materials on a vehicle is prohibited. Violations of any of the aforesaid will result in disciplinary action, loss of decal and authorities may be notified. Students are not permitted to remain in their cars or in the parking lot after arriving on campus. Once a student is on school grounds the only way, he/she may leave campus is by following the sign-out procedure. Students may not enter the parking area at any time during the school day, without an administrator's approval. Failure to adhere to these rules will result in loss of parking decal. Motorcycles must be parked in the designated area. A student parking decal must be displayed. Students driving a motorcycle must wear a helmet while on campus. Failure to abide by the established traffic patterns, failure to abide by the posted speed limits (5 MPH), and /or careless or unsafe operation of a vehicle (spinning tires, revving engines, etc.) will be grounds to revoke and/or deny parking privileges. Students must STOP at all stop signs and stop bars painted on the ground and at all Intersections on campus or their decal will be revoked. Students must have a temporary CCHS decal properly displayed in the lower driver side corner of the windshield with their information facing out. Students who already have a parking decal and need to drive a different vehicle must contact an administrator to

early that day.

obtain a separate temporary decal. Bring in the registration and the insurance card to the Main Office. Arrive

/	Student drivers are <b>NOT permitted to use a cell phone while operating</b> a vehicle on the campus of CCHS. Texting, talking, or the use of social media applications is prohibited because it distracts the driver and create an unsafe environment.
/	Failure to abide by any of the above rules will suspend your parking privilege for the remainder of the school year. Once a parking decal is revoked for breaking the above rules and or guidelines- the student will not be permitted to park on campus for the remainder of the school year.
/	All physical distancing protocols mandated by the Federal, state, local governments as well as SBBC will be strictly enforced.

Since the parking and operation of student vehicles on campus is a privilege, violations of any of the student parking policies will result in the following:

- Violation #1-Warning
- Violation #2- Warning
- Violation #3- Sticker
- Violation #4 -5-day suspension of parking privileges
- Violation #5 -10-day suspension of parking privileges
- Further Violations-Permanent revocation of parking privileges

A hardship request may be considered for the following:

• A student has a physical handicap or disability certified by a local physician or healthcare professional

Parking privileges may be denied or revoked for students who:

- Students who have excessive tardies (greater than 5 tardies in the most recent semester)
- Students who have excessive absences (greater than 3 absences per quarter)
- Students who have excessive disciplinary referrals (either serious level infraction or habitual infractions)
  Students who operate within the parking lot in an unsafe manner or jeopardize the safety of others

We (both parent or guardian and student) have read and understand the above rules and regulations. By signing below, we agree to abide by the rules and regulations set forth by Cooper City High School. The rules have been created to keep all students, guests, and staff as safe as possible.
