To highlight Disabilities Awareness Month, the students in Ms. Moon's class did a project that covers all the categories of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This started when her students had a lot of questions about their own disabilities, and she needed a way to present the information in a delicate, but informative manner, without disclosing any personal information about the students.

Face to face students and e-learners were grouped together in break out rooms and chose disabilities from IDEA's categories to present to the class. They did all their own research and submitted it to an elected group leader. Then, they worked with an adult group monitor to create a PowerPoint Presentation that they presented to their peers. All presentations are research-based but also personal, as some students add their own experiences of having a disability. It is a great way for them to learn about themselves, their disabilities, and how they can help their peers whose disabilities differ from theirs. Even through virtual learning, the students have been able to make it work and have shown themselves and each other everything they are capable of accomplishing. It is a month of students learning together, coping together, and teaching each other.


They are now finalists for the Best of the Best Award in their respective categories at FSPA State Convention in April.

Diamond Awards – Congratulations Ms. Botsch-McGuinn

Diamond coach awards reflect excellence and longevity in the activity. A coach's first Diamond is earned when they receive 15,000 points and have been coaching in the Association for at least five years since achieving the degree of merit (25 points). Five years must pass between each new diamond award, and 15,000 points must be earned to receive a second diamond. An additional 30,000 points must be earned, and five years must pass for each additional diamond.

Ms. Botsch-McGuinn just received her second Diamond in the NSDA. This is a huge honor which measures a coach's longevity in the activity and the success of their students. It takes at least 5 years to earn your first Diamond and then 5 years between each one, including a required number of points that your students earned. Ms. Botsch-McGuinn earned her first Diamond in 2016 and now she has her second. We are so proud of you!

We want to celebrate YOU, the Class of 2021 and your plans after graduation!




WATER POLO (BOYS & GIRLS)



NEW WATER BOTTLE FILLING STATIONS

Broward County Public Schools is pleased to announce that as of Monday, November 23, 2020 all schools have water bottle filling stations available for student and staff use.

Each school location has a minimum of three bottle filling locations. Additional stations will be added to some schools as additional students return for face-to-face instruction.

Following the Thanksgiving holiday, schools will no longer provide bottled water and all students will need to bring a reusable water bottle to school each day.

Additional information about the procedures for these new bottle filling stations is included below.

FAQ's for Face **Covering Violations**

· Is a face covering required?

Yes. Policy 2170-E: Face Coverings requires that a facial covering/mask must be worn while on school campus, at a school-sponsored event, and while on school transportation.

· Can a student be issued a disciplinary violation from the Code of Student Conduct for not wearing a face covering?

Students may be issued disciplinary consequences for actions determined to be intentional, insubordinate, defiant and not accidental or incidental, or when redirection and interventions have been disregarded.

· What should I do if a student refuses to wear or keep on his/her face covering?

Provide reminders and redirection in alignment to the school and/or classroom behavior plan. If the student does not comply with the redirection from staff and the action is deemed to be a repeated disregard to the redirection, a disciplinary referral may be written

• What happens if the student refuses to wear or keep on the face covering while on school transportation?

Bus drivers may submit a disciplinary referral to the school administrator for a Level Two violation if a student does not comply with the reminder and/or redirection.

- Factors such as age, grade level, social-emotional, developmental and intellectual levels, ability and/or disability, and overall student rights and responsibilities will be considered.
- Students with disabilities who are eligible under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504), have additional rights under IDEA or Section 504 and State Board Rule
