Who will be taking the SAT School Day?

All 11th grade scholars at Cooper City High are registered to take the digital SAT.

Select 12th graders who have not met their high school testing requirements have also been registered to take the digital SAT.

What does the SAT do for me?

- The SAT is a college entrance exam that most colleges and universities use to make admission decisions. SAT school day allows greater access to this important examination, and it supports efforts to remove barriers associated with college entrance examinations ensuring equitable access to important steps to college and career readiness.
- For students who have not met their Florida Statewide Assessment English Language Arts Grade 10 graduation requirement, a score of 480 or above on the Evidenced Reading Writing (EBRW) portion of the SAT will meet that graduation requirement. For students who have not met their Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement a score of 420 on the Math section of the SAT will meet that requirement.

SAT School Day Registration and Admission Tickets

Cooper City High 11th grade scholars are registered by Broward County Public Schools to take the March 6, 2024. You will <u>NOT</u> see the SAT School Day registration on your College Board account. You will see the SAT Score Report on your College Board account.

^{*}When calculating SAT end times extra time should be factored in for check in, the Pre ID process, scheduled testing breaks, and testing pick up.

Testing Accommodations

To receive testing accommodations on College Board tests (PSAT 10, PSAT NMSQT, AP, SAT), students must have applied and been approved by College Board. Students with a 504 Plan should check with their Guidance Counselor and students with an IEP Plan should check with their Support Facilitator.

How do I know what testing room I am assigned to?

Students will report to their 5th hour on March 6th. Their room assignment will be distributed, attendance will be taken and students will be dismissed to their testing location.

What to bring on Test Day

- ☆ Your backpack (classes resume after testing)
- ☆ Photo ID (school ID or Driver's license are acceptable)
- ☆ Two or more No. 2 pencils with soft erasers; NO PENS OR MECHANICAL PENCILS
- Acceptable Calculator refer to SAT's Calculator Policy and on the back side of this flyer.

You may also bring

- A snack or drinks can be kept under your desk and can only be eaten/ drank during test breaks at your seat.
- ☆ A jacket or sweater

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☆ Extra batteries or a backup calculator

Trust yourself and stay positive, you got this!

Cell phone, SMART watch, or electronic device policy

Student cell phones or other electronic devices must be turned off and stored in you backpack or given to the test administrator. Phones or other electronic devices brought into the testing room must be shut off and secured in their backpack or with the testing administrator. Phones or other electronic devices can **NOT** be used at any time during the administration of the SAT. If a device makes noise, or a student is seen using it or attempting to access it at any time, including breaks, the student will be dismissed immediately, the student's scores may be cancelled, and the device may be confiscated by College Board.

SAT School Day 2023 Calculator Use

Calculator Rules

- Bring your own College Board approved calculator. You CAN NOT share one.
- Please refer to the <u>SAT Calculator Policy</u> to ensure you have a College Board approved calculator.
- The digital SAT allows calculator use on the entire Math section.

Calculator Best Practices

- Don't bring a brand-new calculator. Bring one you know. Practice for the test using the same calculator you'll use on test day.
- The Math Test includes some questions where it's better not to use a calculator, even though you're allowed to
- It may help to do scratch work on the worksheet provided. Get your thoughts down before using your calculator.
- Make sure your calculator is in good working order and that the batteries are fresh. The test center won't have batteries or extra calculators. If your calculator fails during testing and you have no backup, you'll have to complete the test without it.
