



## **Second Semester Return to Campus Information & Protocols**

- **On Wednesday, January 13, 2021 (A-Day), all students (eLearning from home or on-campus) will begin their first period class of the Second Semester (Third Quarter) at 7:40 AM and will follow their regular class schedule, which can be located on [Virtual Counselor](#). The CBHS Bell Schedule will continue to be 7:40 AM to 2:45 PM.**
- Students who chose to return to campus are encouraged to look up their schedule and classroom numbers by logging into [Virtual Counselor](#) before returning to campus. Staff will be supervising and assisting all students in locating their classroom as we know that this will be the first time that many of them will be on our campus this year. We are here to answer questions and provide guidance to our students. Students on campus will report to their classes each period (change classes and rooms every period).
- **Safety Guidelines:** Parents need to ensure they monitor their students for symptoms of illness each day prior to sending them to school and conduct daily health self-check screening: you can find details of the [self-assessment here on page 24](#). We will not be taking temperatures when students enter campus. We have designated an isolation room for students suspected to have Covid-19 symptoms. A health professional will consult with the Florida Department of Health and determine whether the student has a suspected case and proceed as if it were a confirmed case until proven otherwise. - **While on our CBHS property, all students are expected to comply with all directives related to health and safety.** Students must abide by the safety protocols and CDC guidelines at all times. Those guidelines include physical distancing guidelines and to follow revised school procedures including, but not limited to: staggered dismissal and class release times, one-way traffic, as indicated by signage that is visibly posted throughout the campus and communicated to students (hallways, stairwells, cafeteria, bathrooms, walkways, large areas, etc). Transitions between classes may be staggered, as needed, allowing for fewer students in the hallways at any one time.
- Students should walk directly to their next class **on the Right Side of hallways** when dismissed from classes, following the posted traffic pattern. Congregating in hallways or any campus area will not be allowed, as students must follow **6 feet physical distancing**. Students will have limited movement throughout campus and only at the designated areas to allow for physical distancing. Students will use the restroom when necessary while following CDC guidelines. School staff will conduct daily cleaning of high-frequency touchpoints and special areas. Keeping everyone healthy and safe is our top priority.
- **End of day Dismissal** will be staggered by mode of transportation.
- **Face Coverings:** All students are expected to follow **face-covering requirements** while in school or at school-sponsored activities/events for the health and safety of themselves, school



staff, and others, as outlined in Policy, which will be monitored by staff members. Students who do not comply will be reminded of the Policy, and the student's parent will be contacted. If a student blatantly disregards the health and safety of others and/or refuses to comply with wearing a face covering, discipline will be in accordance with the **Code of Student Conduct**. Per Policy, a face-covering shall be worn during the change of classes, even if it involves the use of outside areas. Proper wearing of a face covering should cover both the person's nose and mouth and should fit snugly against the sides of the person's face with no gaps.

- In accordance with School Board Policy 2170-E, **NO STUDENT** shall not wear a face coverings that are suggestive, revealing, \*indecent1, associated with gangs or cults, encourage the use of drugs, alcohol, or violence, or support discrimination on the basis of age, color, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, linguistic differences, national origin, race, religion, socioeconomic background, sexual, orientation, physical appearance, or any other basis. Additionally, face coverings shall not be used to promote a political party or an individual seeking elected office. If a student needs a face covering, the student will receive a disposable mask from one of our staff members. *\*I Indecent, suggestive, and revealing refer to exposure of private body parts and/or pictures or words with a sexual connotation.*
- Each classroom will be equipped with sanitizing wipes and hand sanitizers, as well as extra masks for students who may need them. Students will wipe down their desks at the end of class, and students may wipe down their desks before starting the next class. All air filters on our campus have been replaced. - Students will not share school supplies. There will not be paper worksheets, shared physical textbooks, non-virtual science labs, shared physical instructional materials, or other instances of shared resources. Students should bring their **fully charged laptop, charger, and earbuds or headphones to campus daily** as part of their school supplies. Each classroom is equipped with power strips so that students can charge their devices throughout the day. Assignments and textbooks will remain electronic via Teams and Canvas as part of the eLearning model. In compliance with public health guidelines, we have set up desks in classrooms to be 6 feet apart and, in most rooms, capacity is at 12-14 desks.
- Teachers will continue to record student attendance in Pinnacle. **Attendance** will be based on the student's presence in the digital or physical classroom. Students will be counted in attendance during their scheduled class time.
- **Sports participation:** whether students are eLearning from home or the campus, they will be able to participate in sports as communicated by our athletic department. At this time, **all other afterschool activities are subject to individual club protocols in accordance with CDC guidelines.**
- **Breakfast and lunch** will be "grab and go" with multiple stations. Seating that ensures physical distancing and procedure for breakfast/lunch line is in place. Students are expected to follow set



guidelines. Signage is clearly displayed. Students are welcome to bring their own lunch if they so choose. The USDA has provided us with the ability to continue providing free meals to all students aged 18 and younger through June 30, 2021, whether students are learning remotely or on campus. We are expanding the square footage of the area where students can eat lunch to spread out significantly to address physical distancing guidelines.

- There will be limited seating in the cafeteria due to 6 feet of physical distancing. The majority of students will eat their lunch in the courtyard in designated enclosed and gated campus areas. Face covering can be removed while eating and seated during lunch in the designated areas (cafeteria and outside areas) and are to be put back on once the student is finished with their breakfast/lunch. CBHS staff will supervise students during lunch and enforce stated procedures. **Water fountains are currently not operational**, so students are encouraged to bring their reusable water bottles which can be refilled using our newly installed water refilling stations throughout campus.
- **Transportation** for students who chose to return to campus will be provided. For students who have requested transportation, bus assignments are located in [Virtual Counselor](#).
