What is the difference between AS and A level exams?

The Advanced Subsidiary (AS) Level syllabus and exam covers the first year of the twoyear A Level curriculum. An AS Level exam counts for one credit towards the AICE Diploma.

Advanced (A) Level Syllabi and exams cover approximately two years of college-level curriculum in a subject. The A Level exam counts for two credits but still is one course.



What happens if I don't earn an AICE Diploma; do I earn college credits?

- All passed classes count toward <u>high</u> <u>school</u> diploma.
- All AICE classes are weighted on 6.0 scale for GPA calculation (like AP and DE classes).
- All passed exams can be used for college credit at Florida public universities/colleges. Out of state colleges/universities award credit based on grade of passed exam.
- Students do not have to earn the AICE Diploma to earn college credits

University Course Equivalents

The Florida Department of Education has established credit course equivalencies for the AICE programs. Additionally, universities throughout the United States accept AICE credits. Colleges and universities award credit on a subject-by subject basis according to grades earned on exams. These various universities' policies may be accessed by visiting the website below:

AICE DIPLOMA

The AICE Diploma is an academic curriculum that requires students to complete 7 AICE classes and pass their respective exams, also known as "papers," within a 25-month testing period (3 school years).

Students who complete the AICE Diploma and have 100 service hours before graduation qualify for the **Florida Academic Scholarship**, which is the highest level of the Bright Futures Scholarship program, regardless of their SAT/ACT score and GPA.
