Dresses:	"Polo" style or plain jumper with approved color shirt underneath
	(Knee length or longer) NO DENIM
Shoes:	Closed toe and back—NO OPENED TOE OR BACKLESS SHOES

ID Badges:	Must be on and visible EVERYDAY

## **Cool Weather Wear**

Jackets, coats in any color will be permitted on extremely cold days. For daily classroom use, preferably plain jackets, sweaters or sweatshirts may be worn.

## INAPPROPRIATE ITEMS AND CLOTHING

- Revealing clothing or clothing that exposes the torso
- Clothing which is not worn appropriately, oversized or low-hanging trousers
- Clothing that exposes the upper thigh
- Sweat pants, jogging attire, leggings, or athletic shorts
- Chains, spikes, bandanas, long dangling belts, gang paraphernalia
- Tattered clothes, clothing with holes or frayed pants or shorts
- Exaggerated or distracting hairstyles and hair colors
