- iv. 2267 projections in Enrollment
  - 1. Does not include reassignment
  - 2. Total Projected Allocation: \$9,168,478
  - 3. 2400 students or so is what it is today
  - 4. Some cuts in number of classes but this is not final
  - 5. Ms Bristol is Chair of all the high schools. She is a budget expert and sits in all budget meetings for all high schools.
  - 6. The district will look at class sizes and make final decisions
  - 7. Accountability Funds will no longer be available (have not received since before COVID)
    - a. We cannot carry money over and will spend the funds as has been decided at other SAC meetings
  - 8. A+ funds will continue

    - 3. Ms. Blackshaw (Ms. Allen nominated)
      - a. Unanimous vote to approve
        - i. Ms. Blackshaw is on the committee
- c. SAC Composition Open Positions
  - i. SAC Composition reviewed
    - 1. Voting members
    - 2. Rules go with SAC Composition
      - a. 51% of the SAC Composition must be present
      - b. 51% must be non BCPS employees
      - c. Each racial group must be within 20% represented at SAC

- d. 300 freshmen coming from feeder school, normally it is 600
- e. Cypress Bay opened 50 seats which took from West Broward
- f. Even MSD opened seats for the first time
- g. Not cutting any programs but downsizing the double math
- h. If there are cuts in math, a math teacher will be placed as a study hall teacher for those kids
- i. EMT program is being added
- j. Dual enrollment was not added due to low number of students signing up
- k. Tuesday before school starts Ms. Bristol will need volunteers Junior and Seniors will get their schedule
- I. Thursday before school starts Freshman and Sophomores will get their schedule
- m. Huntington will receive the monthly newsletter
- n. Student summer volunteers will be able to pick their schedules (200 kids so far)
