In-person Field Trips include activities presented in a round-robin fashion which each class spending a minimum of 20 minutes at each of the following stations. Tours could be modified based on curriculum needs and time limitations: **Historic Pioneer House Tour, Butter Making and Ringing the Historic Ferry Bell, History Hunt, Pollution on the New River**, and **Trading Post**. All in-person programs will follow COVID-19 safety precautions, social distancing, and size restrictions.

CHOOSE YOUR OWN FORT LAUDERDALE ADVENTURE Virtual Experience

A one-of-a-kind interactive trip back in time at the historic Stranahan House. Each tour will be different based on the real-time selections of the participants. Students will visit Fort Lauderdale in 1925 to "meet" Frank and Ivy Stranahan who will give a tour of their homesite and tell stories of their arrival, civic activism, and lasting legacy.

The tour will include authentic historical artifacts, trading post STEAM activities, an at-home butter making activity, and more. Students will also receive a printable activity sheet to compliment the program and continue learning after the tour.



Grade Level: Perfect for all ages Cost: \$100 per class \$85 for Title I schools Duration: 1 to 1½ hour long program Class Size: For groups of 10 to 30 students

CROSSROADS OF HISTORY Virtual Presentation

The program covers a variety of topics in South Florida and United States history from the 1890s through 1920s. Themes will include Women's Suffrage, Native American Culture, African-American Civil Rights, Environmental Conservation, Economic Development, Civic Engagement, and more.

The program will include an understanding of how the Stranahan family experienced, reacted, and responded to topics of change and progress.



Grade Level: Appropriate for High School Students Cost: \$45 per class Duration: 1 hour long program Class Size: For groups of 10 to 30 students





ASK A HISTORIAN Virtual Workshop

This program engages students in real-time interaction with museum historians to discuss both historical topics as well as themes of historic preservation and artifact management. Students will learn about the Stranahans of Fort Lauderdale and learn about behind-the-scenes activities of the museum.

Program topics can be customized to fit curriculum needs and can include guest speaker participation when appropriate including experts in Native American culture, archeologists, architects, and others.

WHERE IT ALL BEGAN In-Person Field Trip

Students will enjoy an in-person tour of Broward County's oldest and most historically significant home site, the Historic Stranahan House Museum. Educators will share the story of Fort Lauderdale's founding family, Frank and Ivy Stranahan, and the homestead they created. Students will be immersed in the pioneer lifestyle while learning about the Stranahans' involvement with the Seminole Indians. This tour will consist of a museum tour, ringing of the historic bell, making butter and participation in a history scavenger hunt.

OLD SOUTH FLORIDA PORTRAIT In-Person Field Trip

Old South Florida Portrait Tour The Historic Stranahan House Museum and Bonnet House Museum & Gardens partner to present a unique, exciting program as students explore two historic homes of pioneer families from the early 20th century. Examine local history while witnessing the environmental impact on the historical sites of the Stranahan House on the New River and the Bonnet House on Fort Lauderdale's beach. Students will compare and contrast the differences between the two families, their homes and their lifestyles with a focus on historic preservation. This tour will consist of a museum tour, ringing of the historic bell, making butter and a presentation about effects of pollution on the New River and how it affects the River's ecosystem.
