SAC Minutes – 04/22/2024

Call to Order:

A meeting of the Eagle Ridge Elementary School Advisory council was held in Media Room on 04/22/2024. Chair, Laura Welser called the meeting to order at 2:33 pm, Katheryne de Lage will record minutes for this meeting.

Minutes:

Mrs. Welser welcomes everyone, she calls for March minutes approval. Ms. Rhule-Rheaume makes first motion and Loretta Martinez seconds the motion. March minutes is approved.

Mrs. Welser updates:

- We need complete the e-prove customer service survey. We need 20% of parents to complete the survey. It gives us school safety information and all the things that we do here. Please fill it out. We need 16 parents, 15 staff members, and 73 students to complete the survey by 4/30/24.
- School Recognition fund is currently 145,542.00, due to A+ money not being distributed. However, on 4/26/2024 instructional staff will have A+ money in their paycheck. Non-instructional staff will have A+ funds in their paycheck on 5/3/24. Thus, the school recognition funds will be less at May's SAC meeting.
- At May's SAC meeting, the school plans to request supplemental funds for UFI supplements: magnetic boards, letters, and electronic pointer for promethean board.
- The School Accountability Funds is currently at \$0.00 dollars. All ordered items except 2 orders have arrived and delivered to all effected teachers.

Principal's Message, Mrs. Sierra welcomes everyone and gave updates.

- The ERE Talent Show will be on May 1, 2024.
- April 25, 2024, is Take Your Child to Work Day. Make sure families complete the permission slip if your child is going to your work.
- Reproductive Health Curriculum email will be sent out on 4/22/2024 for parents to opt out. The curriculum for each grade level is in the office for parents to review before deciding to opt out. Families will need to opt their student out of the curriculum by May 3. As a plan will need to be created as to where to house the opt out students during the lessons. The Reproductive Health curriculum will be taught by classroom teacher. The teachers will use provided PowerPoint slides, and any questions will be referred to the parents. Ms. Rhule Rheame asked if a list of questions asked in class would be provided to the parents. Ms. Sierra stated a plan will need to be created as how to communicate the questions to the families.
- Volunteer Appreciation is this month. Recognized Ms. Miller for her SAF Chair because Ms. Miller did not attend the breakfast.
- Yearbooks can still be ordered, but unable to customize the pages.
- English Language Arts (ELA) tutoring's last day is 4/22/24. The students in ELA tutoring are identified as below proficiency, and the school improvement plan is to increase ELA levels to proficiency. The school and district will assess the ELA tutoring's growth using the iReady Diagnostic 3. The school and district will compare the scores of diagnostic 3 to diagnostic 1 and 2.

- Math tutoring will end on May 8, and also use the iReady Diagnostic 3 to monitor for growth.
- Science Tutoring ends on May 2.
- Ms. Sierra shared May's revised testing calendar. FAST is an adaptive computer assessment. Therefore, to provide the IEP testing accommodations needed, all small groups will be no more than 4 students. Due to many small groups, the small groups may test on different day than the grade level testing. Testing will start on May 1, 2024, and end of May 31, 2024, with whole grade levels, small groups, and make ups.
- FAST results will be immediate, and plans can be made as to who will need alternative testing for promotion.
- iReady Diagnostic 3 window starts on 5/22/24. Everyone will complete iReady Diagnostic 3 as it will help to show growth for this year. The results will also help plan for next year's area for growth.
- It is budget season. At May's SAC meeting Ms. Sierra will present the budget for next year. Most of the budget goes towards salaries.
- Ms. Sierra provide updates for the ESE budget for 23-24 school year. IDEA funding, special programs, IEP.
- Ms. Sierra introduced the Broward School's Director for ESE, Ms. Sheib. The floor was opened for ESE budget questions to be directed to Ms. Sheib. No one asked a question, and floor was closed for questions.

School Improvement Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) Mrs. Glancy

- Ms. Glancy reported ERE had a non-student event: High school students trespassed over winter break. The reporting was complicated by the fact that the students were from different schools, and police involvement. The complication is why the report showed up now, and not in January and Ms. Glancy apologized for the delay.
- Ms. Glancy also reported that there was an unsubstantiated bullying event.
