SIP Mid-Year Reflection Goals by Ms. Figas

- By June 2023, the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient in a level 3 or above in ELA will increase from 48% to 80% as measured by the FAST.

ACCORDING TO PM2 READING DATA, STUDENTS IN GRADES 3-5 INCREASED FROM 48% TO 58%

- By June 2023, 24% of the students in grades 3-5 scored level 1 in ELA. 80% of this subgroup will score at or above a level 2 on FAST ELA.

IN GRADES 3-5 STUDENTS SCORING A LEVEL 1 IN ELA WAS REDUCED FROM 24% TO 17% AS MEASURED BY THE FAST PM 2

- By June 2023, the percentage of students in grades 3-5 in the sub group of Students With Disabilities (SWD) scoring proficient in a level 3 or above in ELA will increase from 23% to 43% as measured by the FAST.

ACCORDING TO FAST PM2 READING DATA, STUDENTS IN GRADES 3 -5 SCORING A LEVEL 3 OR ABOVE IN ELA, INCREASED FROM 48% TO 60%.

Leadership Actions:

1. August Grade Level Teams plan and review units of study based on the BEST standards and Benchmark Resources
2. September Identify students in grades 2-5 to receive targeted interventions for reading based on PM#1 FAST data in ELA.
3. October Admin conduct formal observations targeted on giving feedback to teachers on the implementation of Benchmark Resources.
4. November ELD delivered targeted Professional Development for grades K-5 on how to utilize Benchmark Resources and analyze data.
5. January – Conduct Data Chats with all teachers grades 3-5.
6. February – 1. Begin after school tutoring for identified students in grades 3-5 in reading and math. 2. Train teachers on additional resources for Reading – Scholastic FIRST and Literacy Pro. 3. Continue with teacher data chats for grades K-2.
