Summer Reading Info

WHO: All Class of 2020 Students—ALL rising seniors, regardless of which English class they will take (Honors or Dual Enrollment)

What: 2 Assignments—Read the entire novel, <u>The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn</u>, complete a Dialectical Journal and make a visual representation.

When: Due Date: August 23, 2019—It does not matter when you take English during the year (Term 1 or Term 2), it will be due for every senior on August 23, 2019 in the in the "Class of 2020" Course, under Summer Reading 2019 in D2L.

Where: "Class of 2020" D2L Course—The assignment sheet and rubrics are in D2L. You will submit your projects (both components) to the "Class of 2020" Course, under Summer Reading 2019 in D2L. Students should take a picture of their collage and submit it to D2L as well as bring it to school.

Why: The summer reading work is a preview of the course ahead- reading critically, writing thoughtfully, and speaking/listening purposefully. According to the State Library of Iowa, research shows that people in general learn more slowly during the summer, so it is good to "exercise our brains" more. Furthermore, some students not only slow down in learning but actually regress and lose most of the reading skills they gained during the school year ("Importance of Summer Reading" para. 1).

How: Your Dialectical Journal should use the template provided in the in the "Class of 2020" Course, under Summer Reading 2019 in D2L and follow the corresponding instructions. The collage can be made by hand or by the computer. Submit both the journal and the collage to D2L. If you make your collage by hand, take a picture of it and submit it to D2L, but also bring it to school as well.

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Dialectical Journal (PART I) Mark Twain's <u>The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn</u>

1. Dialectical Journal – will be submitted to the dropbox in D2L in the "Class of 2020" Course, under Summer Reading 2019 no later than August 23, 2019.

How to use a Dialectical Journal:

- a. As you read, choose passages or quotes that stand out to you and record them in the left-hand column in the chart (*ALWAYS include chapter numbers*).
- b. In the right-hand column, write your response to the passage or quote you wrote in the left-hand column: ideas/insights, questions, reflections, comments, etc.
- c. You **must** use the following codes along with your responses:
 - i. (Q) = Question. Ask about something in the passage that is unclear
 - ii. (C) = Connection. Make a connection to your life, the world, or another text.
 - iii. (P) = Prediction. Anticipate what will occur based on what is in the passage.
 - iv. (CL) = Clarification. Answer earlier questions or confirm/disaffirm a prediction.
 - v. (R) = Reflection. Think deeply about what the passage or quote means in a broad sense not just to the characters in the story/author of the article. What conclusions can you draw about the world, human nature, or just the way things work?
 - vi. (E) = Evaluation. Make a judgement about what the author is trying to say.
- d. Refer to the in the "Class of 2020" Course, under Summer Reading 2019 in D2L for the *required* template for your Dialectical Journal.
- e. This assignment will result in one of your first grades, so please start out on the right foot by completing it correctly and submitting it on time.

- a. The collage will be based on your understanding of the theme of <u>The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn</u>. This is an opportunity to let your creativity shine, as the collage is meant to be an artistic representation of theme.
- b. Please carefully read the Making a Collage rubric that has been posted on the D2L Class of 2020 Summer Reading 2019 Course and is also included below. This is exactly how I will be grading the assignment.
