PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Hello Collins Family,

It is hard to believe that we have started the second quarter of the school year! Kudos to you parents for helping to bridge the gap between school and home. You prepare children at home by getting them to bed at an appropriate time, making sure they have school supplies, and getting them to school on time. These areas are critical components for student success, and we appreciate your continued support.

On October 14th we had a Collaborative School Site Visit. The event comprised of District Curriculum personnel who visited classrooms to observe learner engagement within Tier I instruction. Some of you may recall the phrase, Tier I instruction, which is the initial instruction that all students receive, from the Achievement Goals and Contacts. The participants were very impressed with warm, inviting classrooms, our hard-working teachers, and student behavior. In order to move to the next level for increased student achievement, however, more emphasis has to be placed on student accountability for learning. This means that students have to be more engaged in conversations for the sake of learning. Therefore, we are having more conversations with students, and we are asking you to do the same. For example, in addition to asking your child if they had a great day at school, ask them about some of the following areas of learning such as: 1) Describe the main character or the main idea in the book that the class is reading? 2) Explain the process of the math lesson? 3) Tell you about their progress in I-Ready. 4) What is their favorite meal and why? The goal with these discussions is not for judgment or critical eye, but to help students feel comfortable with having meaningful conversations that extend beyond "yes" or "no" answers whether in school or at home.

On a different note, as many of us approach this time of the year, we began to think about holiday plans for Thanksgiving and for the wintertime. We think about turkey dinners, family, and gift giving/receiving. I encourage each and every one of you to make spending time with your family top priority. Entrepreneur Steve Jobs once said, "My favorite things in life don't cost any money. It's really clear that the most precious resource we all have is time." Make the most of this season by creating loving memorable moments with little ones. Love on them by baking those cookies, coloring those pictures, and watching those favorite holiday movies. Little ones don't stay little forever. They grow up, and they learn to love as they have been loved. Have a blessed holiday season.



READING CORNER

Good Readers Make Connections

Good readers make connections with the books that they read. Connections are links that readers make between their prior knowledge and what they are reading. Making connections helps readers to better understand what they are reading.



There are three different types of connections which readers can make. Text-to-self connections are those which readers make between the text and their own experiences. Text-to-text connections are those which readers make between the text they are reading and other texts that a reader has read before. Lastly, text-to-world connections are those which readers make between the text and bigger issues or events which are happening in the world around them.





Families can help build upon a child's background knowledge by providing experiences such as trips to the local farm, the beach, or a museum. Encourage your child to talk about his or her experiences whenever possible and to make connections with the books and stories that they read. Use the questions stems below in your conversations to start and share your connections.

Question Stems:

- How does the story make you feel?
- Have you ever had a similar experience?
- Were you reminded of anything in your own life?
- Do any of the characters remind you of someone in your life?
- Does the book remind you of another book?
- How is this story like any other story you know?
- Does the book remind you of something happening in our world?




