The Florida Department of Education Administrative established <u>Rule 6A-1.094124</u>. This rule requires establishes annually a minimum of five hours of required instruction related to Resiliency Education: Civic and Character Education and Life Skills Education for students in grades 6-12. substance use and misuse health education, child trafficking prevention education, and internet safety prevention education. Ensure that appropriate lessons are assigned to students, as all lessons are grade-level-specific. In addition the rule requires that all students in grades K - 12 receive required instruction in <u>Substance Use and Abuse Health Education</u>, <u>Child Trafficking Education</u>, and <u>Internet Safety Prevention Education</u>.
