Reopening Information and Safety Protocols

Follow the 3 W's

- 1. Wear a mask!
- 2. Watch your distance!
- 3. Wash your hands!

Face Coverings Required!

- 1. All students riding buses are required to bring and wear face coverings.
- 2. On campus, staff and students are required to wear face coverings in all common areas, while in transit within the school, and whenever 6' physical distancing cannot be observed.
- 3. All students are responsible for supplying their own face coverings.

Items Needed EACH day!

- -Students must wear masks at all times.
- -We encourage students to bring water bottles.
- -Students must bring in their charged laptops including the charger.
- -All students must bring in **headphones**.

Sanitization Procedures

Hand Sanitizer

Students and staff entering classrooms will have the ability to sanitize hands before and after using door handles. Hand sanitizer will be placed in all classrooms and various campus common areas.

Sanitization

- 1. Intermittent (between classes) cleaning of desks will be done by students. Teachers will provide students with wipes from district provided wipes.
- 2. Enhanced daily after school cleaning will be completed by staff on all high frequency touch points (i.e. doorknobs, handles, etc.) within classrooms, hallways, offices, clinics, isolation rooms, etc.
- 3. High-frequency touch points in all areas that were occupied during the school day will be cleaned daily.
- 4. Emergency cleaning will be performed if a confirmed positive is determined.

Arrival Procedures

The campus will be open at 7:00 AM. 30 minutes prior to the start of the school day. Students can be dropped off at the front of the school, entering through the front east gate. Walking students can enter through the front east walker's gate that we call, "Sonny's Gate", or they can enter through the walker's gate in the rear, or west side of the school by the bus loop. Students taking the school bus will be dropped off in the bus loop at the back of the school.

Driving students, faculty, and staff enter through the far back gate. All gates will be opened at 7:00 AM. No students are allowed on campus before that time.

Students who choose to eat breakfast must go to the cafeteria. Seating has been arranged to provide 6 feet of social distancing between each student. At 7:20, the breakfast line will be closed, and students will begin being dismissed from the cafeteria to go to class by section.

Students who are not eating will report to the auditorium, where seating capacity has been reduced to also allow for 6 feet of social distancing between all students. At the 7:25 bell, students in the auditorium will be dismissed to class by section.

Classroom Reminders

- 1. Student Capacity will be posted for all classroom based on CDC guidelines.
- 2. Assigned seats for all students in all classes is required.
- 3. eLearning/Canvas utilized to deliver instruction
- 4. Hand sanitizer and wipes available for students to maintain area.
- 5. Overflow Room(s) When a class has exceeded capacity or a non-rostered student shows up, the teacher will call the front desk for an escort to the overflow room. All students need headphones.
- 6. Teachers teaching remotely students whose teacher is NOT teaching from the school building will report to the auditorium for E-learning class.
- 7. Isolation Rooms Students exhibiting signs/symptoms will be escorted to the isolation room.

Classrooms will have logs to account for visitors. Any staff or student visitor not on a teacher or classroom roster that enters a classroom will need to sign a log. Logs will be maintained daily in case of an emergency need to contact trace. Additionally, all overflow rooms will maintain classroom logs.

Traffic Flow Protocols

The **main hallways are wide enough to support physical distancing**. Two-way traffic will be permitted. All staff and students will need to walk to the right. The hallway is divided by a red marker that clearly delineates the lanes of foot traffic.

In the **smaller side hallways, traffic will flow one way only** in a clockwise fashion. Directions are clearly marked.

Stairwells will be one way only and clearly marked. Directional arrows and floor stickers will clearly mark the flow of traffic. Staff will direct students to follow the flow of traffic protocols.



Class Change Procedures

At each class change, students will be released in a staggered manner via a PA announcement.

- At the bell, Group 1 classes in the 300, 600, & 900 hallways will be released.
- 3 minutes later, Group 2 classes in the 500 & 200 hallways will be released.
- Group 3 classes in the 700 & 400 hallways will be released 3 minutes after Group 2.

Upon arrival at their next class, if there are still students in the classroom waiting for their release time, students arriving to class will wait outside of the class 6ft. apart to ensure physical distancing. Red circles mark where students can stand safely while they wait. When all students have exited the classroom, waiting students will enter the class.

Lunch Procedures

Students will have either A or B lunch. Students will be dismissed to lunch in the same manner as class change procedures. Students who choose to get lunch will eat in the cafeteria at clearly marked seats that provide for 6 feet of social distancing.

Students who choose not to get lunch can go outside in the picnic areas, or to Portable 1 where seating is spaced for 6 feet of social distancing.

Dismissal Procedures

At 2:25, all bus riders will be released to catch their bus.

At 2:28, remaining students on the second floor, (500, 600, 700 hallways) will be released.

At 2:30, students on the first floor will be released. Students must exit the building and campus immediately.

Restrooms

Limited use of restrooms will be permitted during hallway transition (two students at a time). Students will need a restroom escort during class time. Teachers will contact front desk to request an escort for students.

Water Fountains

Water fountains have been shut off for students. **Bottled water will be provided by district and distributed upon student request.** Students are encouraged to bring bottled water. Staff will have access to water in designated areas.

Technology

Students will bring their school issued laptops every day. For students that bring their own device, we will not be able to address any concerns or repairs with those devices.

- 1. Student will bring a device (i.e. laptop)
- 2. Students that experience technical issues with their school provided laptops will have their device picked up by support staff in the building and given to Mr. Montgomery to repair or replacement (based on availability).
- 3. Students will be responsible for coming to school each day with a fully charged laptop, or they will have to use one of the school's loaner once their battery dies (based on availability).
- 4. Students will be required to bring their own headphones to school with their laptops each day.

Attendance

Students may continue to work from home during the pandemic; they can participate in eLearning from home and be counted in attendance. Students present during scheduled eLearning classes should not be recorded as absent.

Parents will be expected to communicate with school staff to provide a reason their child is staying home. Parents will continue to be able to call the hotline to report the reason.

If the student participates in eLearning from home, they should be recorded as Present. Proposed new code will be used is H = Present Remotely. This code would represent any student who is in class during the scheduled time but is not at school.

Athletics Update

Return to Play

Beginning on **Monday, October 12**, BCAA member high schools entered Phase 3 of Return to Play. This means high schools were permitted to begin official practices for student athletes participating in fall sports.

During Phase 3:

- · Sport-specific practices begin with both indoor and outdoor sessions.
- \cdot Sport-specific drills are permitted, and sport-specific equipment may be used.
- \cdot Practices are limited to $120\,minutes\,of\,participation\,per\,day.$
- Below are requirements for conducting practices for fall sports.
- \cdot Follow physical distancing guidelines, whenever possible, during indoor and outdoor practices.
- \cdot Wear face coverings at all times, except during active participation in workout sessions/practices.
- \cdot Divide student athletes into pods (small groups) during indoor and outdoor practices. The use of pods is recommended, but not mandatory. Hallandale is implementing pods by position.

• Maintain diligent and effective cleaning and disinfecting of frequently touched objects and surfaces following <u>guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u>.

Coaches must maintain a daily record of athletes that are participating and symptoms they may present.

- Athletes are monitored at start of practice for a temperature of 100.4F/38C or higher and other possible COVID-19 symptoms (fevers, chills, cough, muscle aches, headache, sore throat, runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of taste or smell).
- If a student athlete exhibits symptoms, he or she is not to participate in practice and should be referred to a physician for evaluation and testing.
- Players must bring their own water bottles, shoes, towels and other personal equipment.

We have Coach Rivera, our athletic trainer available for practices. He wears a facial covering during any interactions with athletes and maintains physical distancing, when feasible.

BCAA member school sponsored camps, clinics and open gyms are **prohibited** for any sport, at this time.

We are excited for the start of the football season! Due to strict safety guidelines, Football games will **NOT** be open to the general public. Our games WILL be streamed live.
