

- Identify and coordinates the use of community resources to improve student achievement and school effectiveness.
- Participate in increasing/sustaining high levels of community support for the school.
- Assist SAC in identifying the educational needs and priorities of the school.
- Participate in the preparation of the budget, and review budget related concerns.
- Advocate for positive change in the school.
- Remain current with school, district, state, and national issues.
- Jointly works with School Board Members, Superintendent, and local Government officials.
- Facilities, Safety, Legislative, ESE, ESOL, Boundaries, Curriculum, Dress code, and Transportation are all issues addressed by SAF.

E-Learning Student Guide

All students are expected to log in to TEAMS for every period, every day and participate in class just the way they would if they were in the school building! Teachers are providing live direct instruction via TEAMS each period of the day. Teachers will also use CANVAS to give assignments and feedback. Students are expected to utilize BOTH platforms each day.

1. Log-In- protocol for CLEVER:

2. Sign in with your student number and password/PIN to get to your personalized Clever Single Sign-On Launchpad. Each student's dashboard is different depending on grade level. Below is a sample of one. For young and complex learners, parents/guardians should log in with the student information.



3. How do I get to class?

Click on the Canvas image outlined in red above. Go to Virtual Counselor to get your class schedule and **attend your classes in the proper order**, **according to the virtual bell schedule**.

4. How do I enter class?

Use the "Courses" button on the left blue navigation bar to access your courses. Or you can click on the Canvas Tile to bring you into your Canvas course.

5. How do I find my Canvas work and my Teams web conference link?

Read any of your teacher's announcements at the top of the homepage of your Canvas course and then look for assignments below. If your teacher has designed your work in Modules, click on the Modules link on the left side of your course navigation to begin seeing your units of study. **Your teacher will be providing live web conferencing through Microsoft Teams. The link to these live meetings will be placed in the Announcements of Canvas or in other areas in Canvas such as Calendar Events, Pages, Assignments, Discussions, and Quizzes.**

Student Expectations

Live instruction will be conducted daily, and students are to connect **each period** on Teams and the following expectations must be followed.

• Students need to go to each class at the assigned times.

- Students should inform their teachers when they cannot attend Teams web conferences.
- Students should use their cameras as directed by their teachers.
- Students are to dress appropriately.

To help you participate well in your class web conference follow these simple **virtual meeting netiquette rules and tips**:

- 1. Leave the keyboard alone...
- 2. Dress appropriately...
- 3. Be aware of your surroundings...
- 4. Mute your microphone when you are not talking...
- 5. Speak up, but do not shout...
- 6. No food allowed...
- 7. Stay seated and stay present...
- 8. Find a quiet location with no or minimal background noise
- 9. Turn off all sounds on your phone

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Attendance Counts!

Regular attendance is an important leading indicator to help predict academic success. As our community has begun the 2020/21 school year in the virtual setting, **students are expected to attend eLearning during the scheduled class time by joining the Microsoft TEAMS links provided by their teachers. Students should follow the Virtual Bell Schedule to attend each 90 minute class, each day.**

Students will be recorded as present when they are in attendance during their teacher's live teaching session in the digital learning environment. **Students must log into their daily Microsoft TEAMS**

meetings set up by their teachers.

An absence will be recorded when students are not seen by their teacher during the scheduled class time in the live teaching session.

Parents must report the reason for absence to our school's attendance manager using the Online Absence Reporting Form on our school's website at browardschools.com/hallandalehigh. Under "Contact" in the main menu, select "Report an Absence."Parents will receive an emailed copy of the submitted form, and the submitted form will be reviewed by our attendance manager.

Parents may also report a reason for absence by phone using our school's attendance line by calling 754-323-0902.

The BCPS Mobile App also includes real-time attendance for students from kindergarten through 12th grade. Parents are encouraged to monitor daily student attendance to ensure that their child's attendance is accurate.

PBIS Model School Award: Gold Level

Time to celebrate! Our school has recently been recognized for our work implementing a school-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) framework. PBIS is a set of strategies based in behavioral and biomedical science that enhances student quality of life and reduces problem behaviors. National research shows that full implementation of this framework leads to improved student outcomes.

By establishing this framework, we are developing student skills, making changes to the school environment, acknowledging appropriate student behavior, and using data to identify needed supports for our students.

As a result of this work, we are being recognized by the FLPBIS Project for achieving Gold PBIS Model School status. This award demonstrates our commitment to positive and equitable outcomes for all students and helps us celebrate our efforts as we progress toward full implementation of PBIS.


