In Media, Kindergarten and 1st Grade students have been learning about taking care of books and online safety. We are now reading a variety of versions of "Three Little Pigs" so we can compare and contrast the stories. We are also designing and building better houses for them!

Additionally, we are working on typing and research with grades 2 through 5. They have practiced responding to discussion questions in Canvas as well as used typing games to start learning the various keys on the keyboard. Now they are learning how to find ebooks through Destiny Discover, gather information from the books, and create a PowerPoint about what they have learned. Assignments are leveled for each grade as well.



Between November 28, 2022 and April 28, 2022, CHE students in grades K-5 will be provided with developmentally/age appropriate curriculums concerning Substance Use Disorders and Setting Safe Boundaries. The curriculums are provided by the Broward County Public School District and will be delivered to K-5


