

AT HOME DAILY HEALTH SCREENING

Are you feeling sick or ill today?



Are you awaiting test results for COVID-19?



Have you been told to self-quarantine or self-isolate by a doctor or the Florida Department of Health?



If you can answer "NO" to <u>all of</u>
<u>these questions</u>, proceed to school or work.



If you answered "YES" to any of these questions, do not go to school or work.
