## WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Dual enrollment is an accelerated program that allows secondary students to take post secondary coursework and simultaneously earn both high school and college credits, saving both time and money.

















### GUIDELINES



- •State Board Rule 6A-14.064
- •FL Statutes 1007.271

#### **Tuition and Fees**

- Exempt from the cost of tuition, fees and the cost of instructional materials.
- Parents cannot pay for courses.

#### Who can participate?

- Grades 6-12 can participate in DE
- Must meet eligibility requirements



#### SACSCOC Guidelines



#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

#### **Initial Eligibility**

- Minimum unweighted HS GPA of 3.0
- Min. College level test scores or College Readiness Using Alternative Methods of Placement in all areas - English, Reading and Math
- Permission from parent and school counselor

#### **Continued Eligibility**

- Earn a grade of "C" or higher in each course
- Maintain unweighted HS GPA of 3.0
- Complete DE Recommendation Form each term

 Valid for four (4) years from test date 3.





#### 3 - Alternative Methods – HS Courses

#### **INFORMATION**

- Can meet placement in ENGLISH, READING and MATH
- Valid for four (4) years from course completion

#### **CRITERIA**

- Unweighted HS GPA of 3.0 or higher
- B or higher course grade
- Must be full year course equal to 1.0 high school credits



- AP English Language and Composition (Meets English & Reading Placement)
- AICE General Paper (Meets English & Reading Placement)
- Algebra (Meets Math Placement)
- Geometry (Meets Math Placement)



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#### DUAL ENROLLMENT vs. EARLY ADMISSIONS

Dual Enrollment	Early Admissions
School counselor advises allowed credits per term (May not be full time)	Must enroll into a minimum of 12 credits (Must be full time)
Can be in any grade in high school	Must be a senior in high school
Not required to enroll in consecutive terms	Must enroll for the Fall and Spring Terms
Take courses at college while still attending high school	Only take BC courses





## DID YOU KNOW?

#### **Dual Enrollment Courses**

- Will transfer to any Florida public college or university
- Count towards the beginning of your college transcripts
- May not be repeated while still enrolled in the dual enrollment program (includes withdrawals)
- May not be audited





## WHAT CLASSES SHOULD I REGISTER FOR?















Review with your counselor what courses you have left to complete for high school graduation.

The most important thing to remember is that graduating from high school is your priority.

General education courses

What do you want your major to be in college?

Should not take courses at BC that you are already going to earn credit for from an AP class.

Can take any courses on the DE Approved Course List

Must meet all prerequisites and placement

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#### **BC APPLICATION PROCESS**

#### Step 1:

Confirm with counselor if eligibility requirements are met.

Step 2: Submit a BC Online Application – www.broward. edu (Click Apply)

Step 3: Take a placement exam (if needed)

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### DUAL ENROLLMENT FORM

- Go to <u>www.broward.edu/dual</u>.
- Click on New Students (or Continuing Students) tile.
- Look for Steps for Enrollment.
- Click on link for Dual Enrollment Recommendation Form.
- Will be prompted to log into BC One Access Account to access form.
- Complete form and upload Parent/Legal Guardian Form.
  - No electronic or typed signatures will be accepted.
- Submit form and will be routed to school for approval.



### PLACEMENT TESTING

Do you need to take the common placement exam at BC?

- Visit <u>www.broward.edu/dual</u>.
- Click on <u>Testing tile</u>. You can take the exam in person or remotely.
- If in person, you will need to make an appointment.
- If remote, fill out the <u>Remote Testing Request Form</u>.
- Voucher sent to Personal Email address.
- Follow instructions in email to schedule remote exam.
- Scores available at end of exam.
- Share scores with school counselor.

#### HOW DO I REGISTER FOR CLASSES?

- Log into your BC One Access account beginning the first day of registration.
- Register for your courses <u>online</u> and provide your schedule back to your counselor.
- If taking courses at the HS site, BC will register you for those course sections.


#### PARKING AND TEXTBOOKS

#### **Parking**

- Open Campus
- No parking decal required (don't park in faculty spots)
- Any issues, contact campus safety at 954-201-HELP (4357).

#### **Textbooks**

- Order your books online for pick up or just go in person.
- Advise the bookstore staff you are DE and what school you attend.
- Not required to pay for books, access codes, lab coats and goggles, and select art supplies.





#### DROP/WITHDRAWAL PROCESS

How to drop::

Students drop/withdraw online or at a BC Campus by drop or withdrawal date located on student schedule.

**Drop Date:** 

About a week after class begins depending on session

Withdrawal Date:

Occurs 60% into the Session. Last date a student can withdraw without grade penalty. Dates are indicated on the academic calendar.

Please make sure when dropping that you click on complete transaction so its processed. Dates are indications on the Academic Calendar.
