Cambridge AICE Diploma Curriculum

The Cambridge AICE Diploma coursework is composed of engaging and rigorous Cambridge International AS & A Level classes spanning diverse subject groups. To achieve the AICE Diploma, all learners must pass the examinations for a minimum of seven courses in designated subject areas, within a 25-month period, which begins with their first exam series. Course requirements include the compulsory **Cambridge International AS Level Global Perspectives & Research** course and at least one course each from groups 1, 2, and 3. The remaining credits can be selected from any of the four subject groups.

Group 1: Mathematics and SciencesGroup 2: LanguagesGroup 3: Arts and HumanitiesGroup 4: Interdisciplinary subjects (optional- maximum of 2 credits toward diploma)

AICE Diploma and Bright Futures

Students who earn their AICE diploma prior to high school graduation, complete the 100 hours of community service requirement, and submit their Florida Financial Aid Applications will qualify for the Florida Academic Scholars award (full Bright Futures scholarship).
