Graphic-

- 1. <u>Complete a Plot Diagram</u>-Complete a Plot diagram for your novel by identifying the exposition, rising action, climax, falling action, and resolution of the novel. Please have at least 4 sentences for each element.
- 2. The Top 10- Create a list of the top 10 things you enjoyed about your novel. What were your favorite parts?
- 3. <u>Create a 3 W's chart</u>- The first W is- "What do I already know about this book." The second W is- "What do I want to know about this book." The third W is- "What have I learned from reading this book." Be sure you have at least a 4-5 sentence paragraph for each W.

Kinesthetic-

- 1. <u>Create a Puzzle Board</u>-Create a puzzle board that has pictures and a discussion of the story in the form of puzzle pieces. Draw the puzzle pieces on paper or construction paper.
- 2. <u>Character Creation</u>-Decorate an old coffee can or similar small container with pictures, events, and writings about a character in your novel.
- 3. <u>Dice Scenes</u>- Using oversized dice, draw scenes on each side that illustrates an important event in your novel.

Oral-

- 1. <u>Decisions</u>, <u>Decisions</u>- Create a list of important decisions that were made by different characters in your novel. Then explain the effects those decisions had on the rest of the story (1 page).
- 2. <u>Listen Up</u>-Persuade other students to read your book by writing a radio advertisement about the book (2-3 paragraphs).
- 3. <u>Novel Discussion Questions</u>-Create a list of 10 questions that you can use for a novel discussion. Be sure to add at least 3 short response questions.

Technological-

- 1. <u>Novel Prezi Presentation</u>- Go to prezi.com and create a Prezi presentation of your novel. Discuss the characters in your book, add pictures, and give an *original* summary of it.
- 2. <u>Book Trailer</u>-Similar to a movie trailer, create/record a one-two minute video to tell students about your novel.
- 3. <u>Kahoot Game</u>- Go to https://getkahoot.com and create an original Kahoot game for your novel. It must be at least 10 questions and answers.

Visual-

- 1. <u>Novel Postcards</u>-Imagine that you are one of the main characters in your novel, then create 5 postcards that you could send to friends. You must stay in character as you create these postcards.
- 2. <u>Draw the highlights</u>-Think about the best, most exciting events of your novel then draw them on paper in the order in which it appeared in your novel (minimum of 4-5 events).
- 3. <u>Main Idea Tree</u>- Create a Main Idea Tree. The trunk of the tree will tell the main idea of the novel and the branches will be the supporting details. Be sure to have at least 8 supporting detail branches.

Written-

- 1. <u>In the News</u>- Write a news report that could be read in the local newspaper or heard on the evening news. The news report should tell the main events of your novel (3-4 paragraphs).
- 2. <u>Create a New Ending</u>- Imagine that you are the author of the novel. Now, write a new ending for your novel. It Must be at least 3-4 paragraphs.
- 3. Question the Author-Write a letter to the author of the book, asking various questions about the novel and about why the author chose to write it. Must be at least 3-4 paragraphs.
