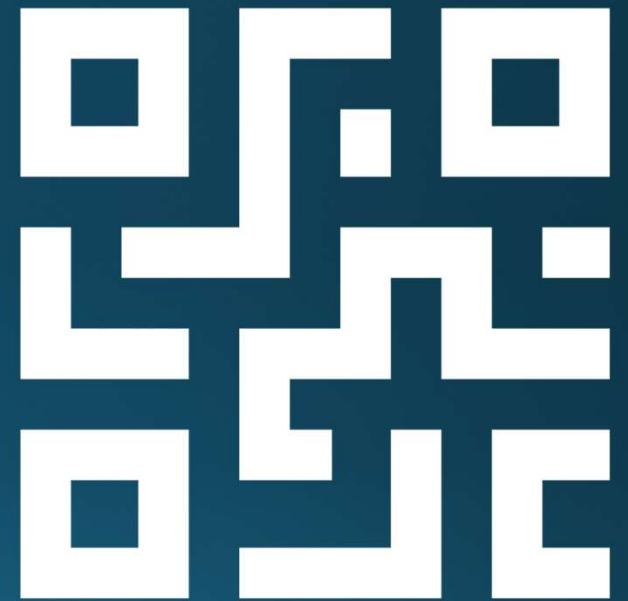

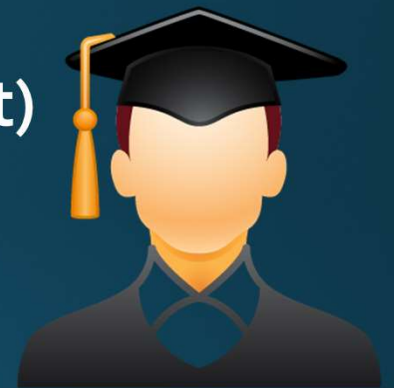

Dual enrollment is an accelerated program that allows secondary students to take post secondary coursework and simultaneously earn both high school and college credits, saving both time and money.

GUIDELINES



- State Board Rule 6A-14.064

- FL Statutes 1007.271

Tuition and Fees

- Exempt from the cost of tuition, fees and the cost of instructional material
- Parents cannot pay for courses.

Who can participate?

- Grades 6-12 can participate in DE
- Must meet eligibility requirements



- SACSCOC Guidelines

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Initial Eligibility

- Minimum unweighted HS GPA of 3.0
- Min. College level test scores or College Readiness Using Alternative Methods of Placement in all areas - English, Reading and Math
- Permission from parent and school counselor

Continued Eligibility

- Earn a grade of “C” or higher in each course
- Maintain unweighted HS GPA of 3.0
- Complete DE Recommendation Form each term

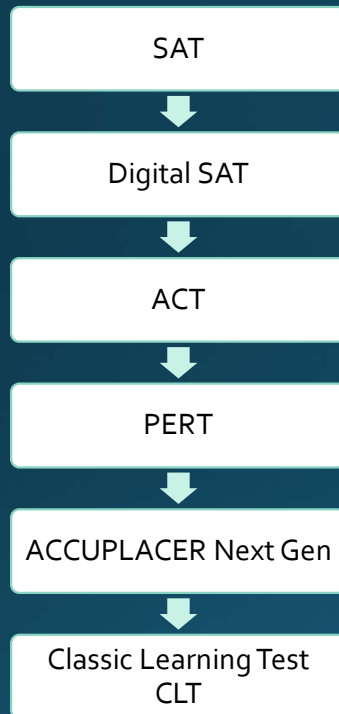

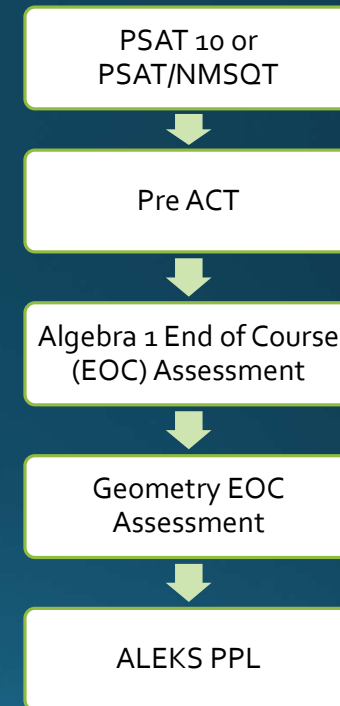

INFORMATION

- Can meet placement in ENGLISH, READING and MATH

CRITERIA

- Unweighted HS GPA of 3.0 or higher

- Must be full year course equal to 1.0 high school credits

DUAL ENROLLMENT vs. EARLY ADMISSIONS

Dual Enrollment	Early Admissions
School counselor advises allowed credits per term (May not be full time)	Must enroll into a minimum of 12 credits (Must be full time)
Can be in any grade in high school	Must be a senior in high school
Not required to enroll in consecutive terms	Must enroll for the Fall and Spring Terms
Take courses at college while still attending high school	Only take BC courses

Dual Enrollment Courses

- Will transfer to any Florida public college or university
- Count towards the beginning of your college transcripts
- May not be repeated while still enrolled in the dual enrollment program (includes withdrawals)
- May not be audited

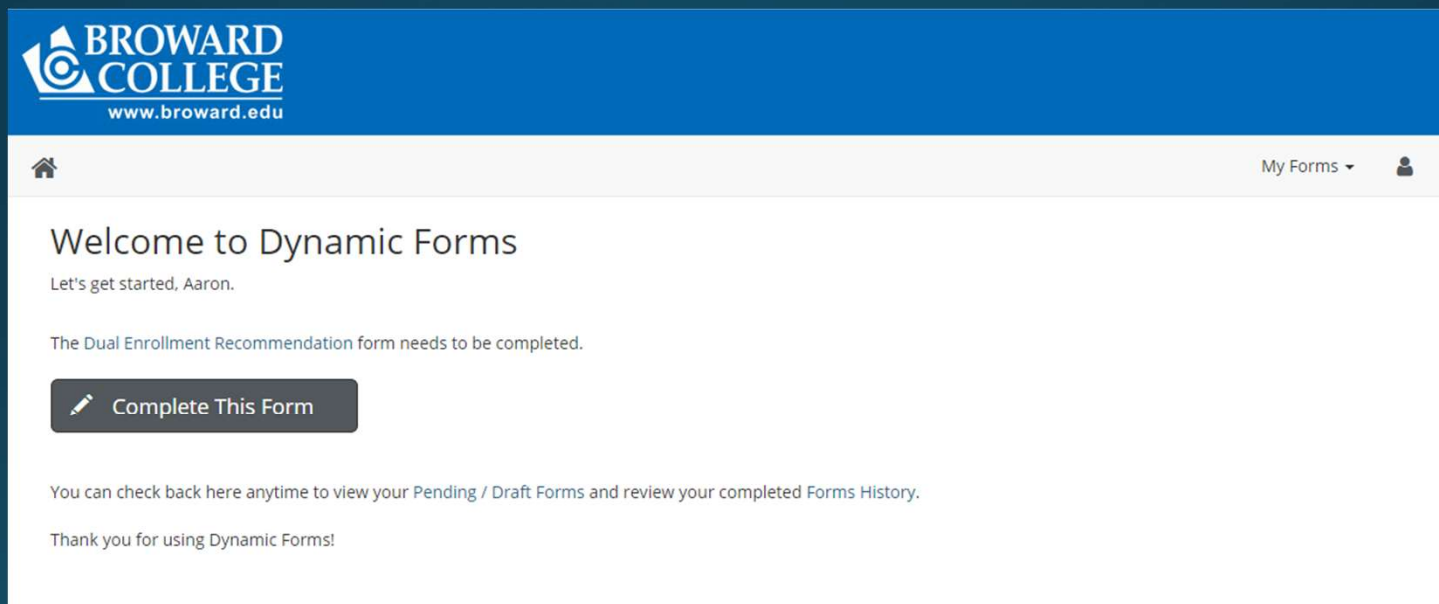

The intention of this form is for the parent/legal guardian to grant permission for the student to participate in the dual enrollment program at Broward College each term. The following information is the same information as listed on the Dual Enrollment Recommendation Form for students.

Please read and sign below acknowledging that you understand and adhere to the information on this form.

Admissions Criteria for High School Students

1. Initial Eligibility Requirements - High school unweighted 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale, and testing college-ready in all areas: English, Reading and Math.

Continued Eligibility - Earn a grade of "C" or better in each course and maintain a 2.0 college grade point average on a 4.0 scale. If the student is projected to graduate from high school before the scheduled completion date of a postsecondary course, the student may not register for dual enrollment. The student may apply to the college and pay the required registration, tuition, and fees if the student meets the college's admission requirements under s. 1007.263.

2. Students participating exclusively in the Student Life Skills (SLS) course must be a high school senior with an unweighted GPA of 2.5-2.9, as indicated in the Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement.

Accessibility Resources

1. Students requesting academic accommodations due to a disability must contact [Broward College's Accessibility Resources](#) department to apply for services.

2. If approved, students will be provided with an accommodation plan to deliver to their instructors. Once received, accommodations will begin in that class. Any grades received prior to this date will not be changed.

3. Different laws apply to college than high school. As such, accommodations approved at Broward College may be different than those in high school.

College-Level Course Outcomes and Expectations

1. Any letter grade below a "C" will not count as credit toward satisfaction of the requirements in Rule 6A-10.030, F.A.C. All grades are calculated in a student's GPA and will appear on the student's permanent college transcript. Withdrawals may affect subsequent postsecondary admission, financial aid and scholarship opportunities. Students may not repeat courses of which a W, WN, D or F grade was earned while in the DE program.

2. While appropriate for college-level study, course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typically included in secondary courses. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity.

3. To minimize student costs for excess hours, parents, students and their school counselor should select courses to meet high school graduation and college degree requirements, including approved program common prerequisites. General education courses are strongly encouraged. Visit our [Dual Enrollment Home Page](#) for a complete list of dual enrollment approved courses.

Attendance/Drop/Withdrawal Requirements

It is the student's responsibility to attend all classes in which the student is enrolled. Students who wish to drop or withdraw from a course are responsible for completing this process online or at a BC admissions office by the published deadline dates on the academic calendar by session. Students must notify their school counselor if they choose to drop or withdraw from a course. Each faculty member is required to report non-attendance through the enrollment verification period which will result in a grade of WN on a student's transcript.

CHECKING THE STATUS OF MY RECOMMENDATION FORM

What to do if Recommendation Form is Returned to student

1. Student clicks on link to Summer DE Form. Same as before
2. Student will be prompted to log into BC One Access Account. ENC1101 pre-req
3. Student should click on "My Forms" at the top right-hand side of website. Confirm placement
4. Click on "Pending/Draft Forms". @ Western or BC?
5. Look for the form with a "Status" that says "Returned".
6. Click on "Actions" and choose "Complete Form" from the drop-down menu.
7. Student can update form, sign form, and re-submit form for it to be routed to the school counselor for review.

HOW MANY COURSES CAN I TAKE?

- 9th - 10th graders can take ONE class each semester at BC.
 - They can take the class on the high school campus (if offered) or on the college campus.
- 11th graders can take a total of two classes each semester. HOWEVER....
 - They can **only** take ONE class each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.
 - They can take the second DE course on your high school campus (if BC DE courses are offered on the high school campus).
 - If you do not have any DE courses on your campus, or if the student is not interested in taking the DE course on your campus then that student would only be allowed to take a total of ONE class each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.
- 12th graders can take a total of three classes each semester. HOWEVER....
 - They can **only** take TWO classes each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.
 - They can take the third DE course on your high school campus if you offer DE courses on your high school campus (if BC DE courses are offered on the high school campus).
 - If you do not have any DE courses on your campus, or if the student is not interested in taking the DE course on your campus then that student would only be allowed to take a total of TWO classes each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.

WHAT SHOULD I DO WHEN REGISTRATION OPENS?

1) When Registration opens, log in to your BC Account and register for course(s) from your approved course list on your Recommendation Form.

❑ Reasons you may receive an Error Message:

- The course was not approved on your Recommendation Form
- The course is Restricted (see sample Special Designators below)

- The course requires you to sign up for both the lecture & lab at the same time (see example below)

HOW DO I REGISTER FOR CLASSES?

- ❖ Log into your BC One Access account beginning the first day of registration.
- ❖ Register for your courses online and provide your schedule back to your counselor.
- ❖ If taking courses at the HS site, BC will register you for those course sections.

WHAT TIME SHOULD I SCHEDULE MY DE/EA CLASS(ES)?

○ Early Admissions

No time restrictions for scheduling. Students take courses full time @ BC or BC Online.

○ Dual Enrollment

- If taking 1 DE course off-campus, 1 high school course will be removed from your schedule, as well as your Personalization Period (optional).
- If taking 2 DE courses off-campus, 2 high school courses will be removed from your schedule, as well as your Personalization Period (optional).
- The class periods removed from your high school schedule will appear as Study Hall. During these times, students are expected to be off-campus working on their DE course(s).

WHAT SHOULD I DO ONCE MY BC SCHEDULE IS FINALIZED?

- ✓ Send a PDF copy of your finalized BC schedule to your school's BC Dual Enrollment Coordinator.
- ⊘ Do not send screenshots or schedules still in draft
- ✓ When sending your final schedule, include which class(es) you would like to have removed from your high school schedule.
- ✓ Remember, your high school schedule will not be adjusted until we receive a copy of your finalized BC schedule.
- ✓ Notify the high school BC Dual Enrollment Coordinator should you make any changes to your BC schedule.

DROP/WITHDRAWAL PROCESS

How to drop::

Students drop/withdraw online or at a BC Campus by drop or withdrawal date located on student schedule.

Drop Date:

About a week after class begins depending on session

Withdrawal Date:

Occurs 60% into the Session. Last date a student can withdraw without grade penalty. Dates are indicated on the academic calendar.

- ❖ Please make sure when dropping that you click on complete transaction so its processed. Dates are indications on the Academic Calendar.

- ✓ Receive approval from your high school (via the signed Permission Form)
- ✓ Have at least a 3.0 unweighted cumulative high school GPA
- ✓ Have completed at least 4 high school credits, with 1 credit in English and 1 in math
- ✓ Take the ACT, SAT, Accuplacer, CLT, or PERT and achieve all of the minimum scores on any one test (listed below). Scores from different tests cannot be mixed and matched.

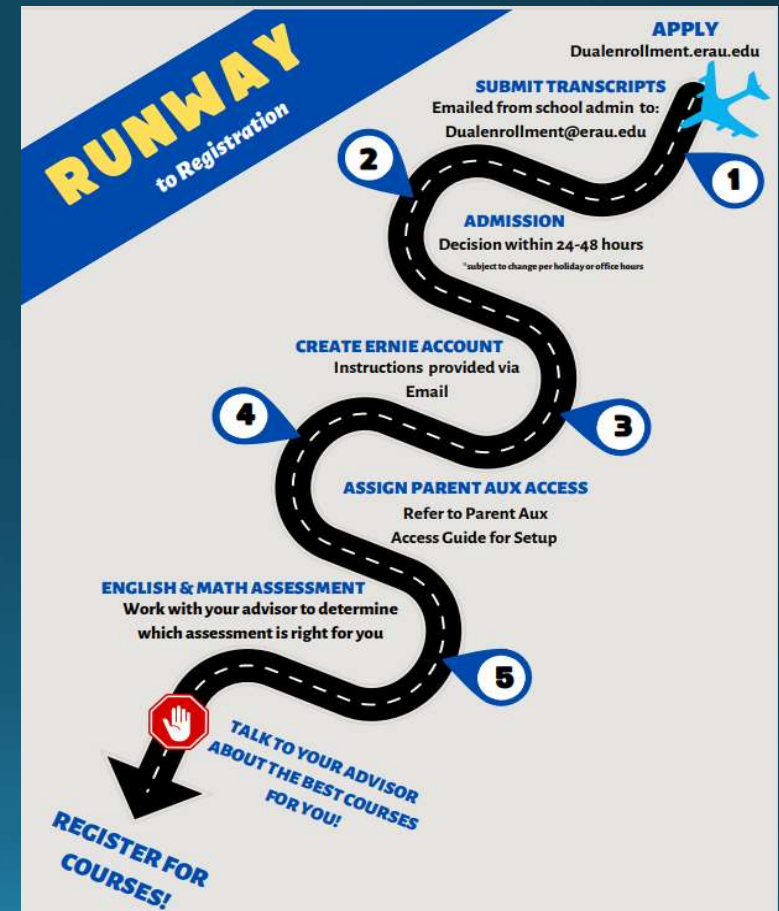
When selecting students to participate in the Dual Enrollment program, Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University considers all aspects of the student's qualifications. During the admissions process, Embry-Riddle evaluates:

- Academic Rigor of all completed high school coursework
- Unweighted High School CGPA of at least a 2.75 (4.0 scale)

It is expected that all applicants:

- Are in grades 9-12 or equivalent (9th-grade students are reviewed on a case-by-case basis)
- Reside in a dual enrollment authorized state and/or country

What is Career Dual Enrollment?

Career Dual Enrollment is an option for high school students to enroll in postsecondary courses earning credit toward both high school graduation and a career and technical program certificate. Students receive two additional quality points on their weighted GPA for every course taken within the program that is completed with a grade of "C" or better.

When can a student begin the Career Dual Enrollment Process?

Students can enroll at the beginning of their junior year (minimum 16 years old). Students that enroll in their senior year may not be able to complete a program as a high school student. Opportunity to complete as an adult student is available.

What are the entry requirements to be Career Dual Enrolled?

Career Dual Enrollment entry requirements are met when:

- A student has completed a minimum of 11 high school credits
- A student has met the minimum 2.0 unweighted grade point average (GPA)
- A student has sat for the Basic Skills test. Technical College counselor approval is required.
- A student is scheduled for a minimum of two (2) courses/credits per semester at a BTC
