

Dual enrollment is an accelerated program that allows secondary students to take post secondary coursework and simultaneously earn both high school and college credits, saving both time and money.



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

Students participating exclusively in the Student Life Skits (SLS) course must be a high school senior with an unweighted GPA of 2.5-2.9, as indicated in the Dual Enrollment Articulation Agreement.

- 1. Students requesting academic accommodations due to a disability must contact Broward College's Accessibility Resources department to apply for services.
- If approved, students will be provided with an accommodation plan to deliver to their instructors. Once received, accommodations will begin in that class. Any grades received prior to this date will not be changed.
- 3. Different laws apply to college than high school. As such, accommodations approved at Broward College may be different than those in high school.

College-Lavel Course Outcomes and Expectations

- 1. Any letter grade below a "C" will not count as credit toward satisfaction of the requirements in Rule 6A-10.030, F.A.C. All grades are calculated in a student's GPA and will appear on the student's permanent college transcript. Withdrawals may affect subsequent postsecondary admission, financial aid and scholarship opportunities. Students may not repeat courses of which a W, WN, D or F grade was earned while in the DE program.
- 2. While appropriate for college-tevel study, course materials and class discussions may reflect topics not typicall included in secondary courses. Courses will not be modified to accommodate variations in student age and/or maturity
- 3. To minimize student costs for excess hours, parents, students and their school counselor should select courses to meet high school graduation and college degree requirements, including approved program common prerequisities.

Attendance/Drop/Withdrawal Requirements

It is the student's responsibility to attend all classes in which the student is enrolled. Students must notify their school courselor if they choose to drop or withdraw from a course. Each faculty member is required to report non-attendance through the enrollment verification period which will result in a grade of WN on a student's transcript.

HOW MANY COURSES CAN I TAKE?

- ogth 10th graders can take ONE class each semester at BC.
 - They can take the class on the high school campus (if offered) or on the college campus.
- o 11th graders can take a total of two classes each semester. HOWEVER....
 - They can **only** take <u>ONE</u> class each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.
 - They can take the second DE course on your high school campus (if BC DE courses are offered on the high school campus).
 - If you do not have any DE courses on your campus, or if the student is not interested in taking the DE course on your campus then that student would only be allowed to take a total of ONE class each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.

o 12th graders can take a total of three classes each semester. HOWEVER....

- They can only take <u>TWO</u> classes each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.
- They can take the third DE course on your high school campus if you offer DE courses on your high school campus (if BC DE courses are offered on the high school campus).
- If you do not have any DE courses on your campus, or if the student is not interested in taking the DE course on your campus then that student would only be allowed to take a total of TWO classes each semester on the BC campus, online through BC, on the FAU campus, online at FAU, or online at UF.

WHAT CLASSES SHOULD I REGISTER FOR?







- Are in grades 9-12 or equivalent (9th-grade students are reviewed on a caseby-case basis)
- · Reside in a dual enrollment authorized state and/or country

All prospective students are required to complete the Online Application for admission to the program.

What is Career Dual Enrollment?

Career Dual Enrollment is an option for high school students to enroll in postsecondary courses earning credit toward both high school graduation and a career and technical program certificate. Students receive two additional quality points on their weighted GPA for every course taken within the program that is completed with a grade of "C" or better.

When can a student begin the Career Dual Enrollment Process? Students can enroll at the beginning of their junior year (minimum 16 years old). Students that enroll in their senior year may not be able to complete a program as a high school student. Opportunity to complete as an adult student is available.

What are the entry requirements to be Career Dual Enrolled? Career Dual Enrollment entry requirements are met when:

- A student has completed a minimum of 11 high school credits
- A student has met the minimum 2.0 unweighted grade point average (GPA)
- A student has sat for the Basic Skills test. Technical College counselor approval is required.
- A student is scheduled for a minimum of two (2) courses/credits per semester at a BTC
