Talk to your children about what they read at school and home. Ask your child questions that include the following: sequence of the story, story elements: characters, setting, problem, and solution. It is important that students can summarize what they read and discuss the genre of the book. Don't

forget that second graders need to be fluent in their math facts through the number twenty. They should be counting coins to find the value and telling time. Third, you can help your child by using flash cards and using online practice with I-Ready. We appreciate all your help and support. Fourth graders will take the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) for English, Language Arts on May 1st and 2nd, and the Mathematics portion on May 7th and 8th. Thank you for



having your child arrive at school on time and well rested. Our students have worked extremely hard this year on all the academic skills needed to show proficiency on the tests. Children should continue to read 30 minutes daily and continue practicing their multiplication facts. They should also utilize iReady reading and math for additional preparation.


Davie Elementary Students Have Proven To be True Bucket Fillers!

We were able to complete the friction parts of force and motion in primary and intermediate grade levels during the last specials rotation. The lessons kind of "rubbed me the wrong way", but I was determined to overcome the "friction" and begin investigating MOTION.

In the Primary grade level, we will be "rollin' rollin' with marbles. I am curious to find out which marble--the one with the most mass OR the one with the least mass--will move the farthest when rolled down the same inclined plane, or ramp.

In the Intermediate grade levels, we will be investigating how a spherical mass of wood moves compared to a spherical lead mass with the same diameter, when the same force is applied to the both masses simultaneously, or at the same time.
