## **Second Graders Prepare for Florida State Standards Testing**

Our second graders are working hard to develop necessary skills to be successful with the Florida State Standards. Students are sounding out words, learning new vocabulary, using think aloud strategies to build comprehension, as well as, rereading passages to increase reading fluency. All students need to learn their basic math facts to 20 so they are ready to begin addition and subtraction with regrouping. Please use I-Ready at home to help improve these skills.



Students will be attending a special science assembly on December 5th. Please check your child's homework folder for permission slips and provide the online payment at our school's e-store. The directions for on-line payments are on the permission slip.

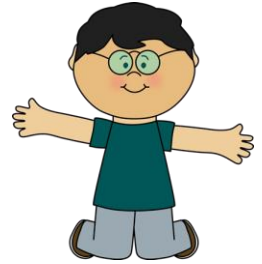
## Musical Notes
