Accelerated Reader (AR) is a program to motivate students to become independent readers while enhancing their comprehension. The children read stories from a specific list of books then take computerized comprehension tests based on their knowledge of the book. The points students receive based on the tests accumulate for the end of year awards.

Certificate Level	5	7	10	10	15
Pin Level	15	20	25	35	40
Ribbon Level	25	35	40	60	70
Medal Level	35	50	60	80	90
Trophy Level	50	65	80	100	115

OFF THE CHARTS STATUS– Any student who exceeds trophy level.

TOP POINT EARNER STATUS – The student who has the most points and at least 80% comprehension at each grade level.

SCHOOLWIDE TOP POINT EARNER STATUS - The student who has the most points and at least 80% comprehension for the entire school.
