On Wednesday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, our STEM teacher Ms. Putney along with other Kindergarten through Second grade staff will present our K-2 STEM Science Night. Please join us at 6:30 p.m. for a fun-filled, hands-on and scientific problem-solving learning opportunity. It's also a great time to see our STEM laboratory! January 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> - BSA ELA Reading (Grades 3-5)  
January 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> - BSA Science (Grade 5)  
January 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> - BSA Mathematics (Grades 3-5)
