For example: read two chapters every day, spend a day writing the report, and another day revising it. As the week progresses, ask how things are going. Talk about possible solutions if problems come up. At the end of the week, help your child evaluate how well he did. Did your child achieve the goal? Most important, praise your child for trying.
