**Exercise to the Daily Routine** 

Today, children and adults do not get as much physical activity, as technology has played a role in the declining levels of physical activity. **Add Keep Up-To-Date Calendars**

Keeping track of family activities is not easy. It helps to have one large family calendar, plus individual calendars for family members. Check them daily. Here are some suggestions:

- ✓ Make sure your large calendar has plenty of space for writing. Mark key dates such as doctor visits and after school activities.
- ✓ Have family members check it often and update it weekly, perhaps on Sunday night. This is a good time to add family information to personal calendars, too.
- ✓ Use individual calendars for detailed scheduling. For example, your child's calendar should include long-term plans, such as how he will prepare for a test.
- ✓ Check calendars before making new plans. Record new commitments right away.
