

From the Principal's Desk:

Our students and staff enjoyed Literacy Week! It was wonderful to see so many characters come to life at Tradewinds Elementary and students were able to share a variety of genres and authors with their peers. On Thursday, our fifth graders were dressed for success and demonstrated professional behavior while attending Junior Achievement's Biz Town. Two extended learning programs are scheduled to begin this week: The Soaring Eagle Clubs - these eight-week sessions are instructed by our teachers and coordinated by Mrs. Dorman, our Literacy Coach and our Language Enrichment Camp is also being instructed by our teachers, coordinated by Mrs. Quezada, ESOL Resource Teacher. Both of these programs will take place after school and begin this week.

The Broward Standards Assessment (BSA) is behind us and our instructional team not only looks at student strengths and areas needing growth, but how students tested. Please encourage your child to always do their best and ask these follow up questions: How did you think that you performed?, What strategies did you use in Math (Grades 3-5), Reading (Grades 3-5 and Science (Grade 5)? How has your writing improved (Grades K-5)? and Did you understand what the questions were asking you to do? While the BSA was being administered, Grades K, 1 and 2 are assessing on the Benchmark Assessment System (BAS). Your child(ren)'s teachers are available to share these results as we progress monitor student academic development.

Here are a few friendly reminders. Tradewinds is a unified dress school and students are expected to follow the color patterns of hunter green, gold, khaki and white. As these colors may be a bit challenging to find during certain seasons, students are permitted to wear variations of greens and yellows. Additionally, our PTA sells school spirit items and clothing. For your convenience, staff accepts students on the car line beginning at 7:15. All students are to be at their seats and ready to learn by the 8:00 bell. For the safety of all students, parents and staff, please continue to be patient in the car line. Double parking, walking in front of vehicles, jaywalking through the parking lot and the use of cell phones are all dangerous sighting that have been evident over the past several weeks. The Breakfast Program is free for all students, however, everyone is to be in line prior to the 7:55 bell (7:30-7:55).
