Dear Owl Families,

It is our pleasure to welcome you to the 2022-2023 school year as we are "One TEAM, One Dream...No Limits". We believe the impact we will have this school year will reflect our theme, and we are profoundly humbled and driven by the continued support from our families and community.

Our school hours are 8:00 am-2:00 pm each day. Breakfast and Lunch will be free this year for all students. If your student is having breakfast, please drop them off in the front/north parking lot. Breakfast begins at 7:15 daily, and as a reminder there will be no adult supervision before 7:15. Safety continues to be one of our top priorities at Maplewood. Our east and west gates will remain locked throughout the school day. The east gates will close after arrival daily at 8:00 and west gates will close at 7:50 am for student drop off and arrival.

Arrival Procedures: Students in grades 3rd-5th will be dropped off in the front of the school each morning. Students in grades K-2 will be dropped off in our west parking lot until 7:50 each morning, after that time, they will be dropped off in the front. Our Pre- K & Special Programs students will be dropped off in the bus loop and must have the hanging car tag to be granted entry.

Dismissal Procedures: Special Programs and Pre-K students will begin dismissal at 1:45, so please ensure that car tags are visible. Please ensure that you are using the new 22-23 school year car tags. **Students will not be released without a current car tag**. Our Special Programs, Pre-K, & K-2 families will be dismissed from our west lot and our 3rd-5th grade families will be dismissed from the front of the school. All older siblings will be dismissed with the younger sibling in the family.

Every staff member and student will receive an ID badge that must be worn during school hours. If your child misplaces their ID badge, they must notify their teacher immediately. We are all here to answer any questions or concerns that you may have. We are proud and privileged to be your administrative team and are honored to work at Maplewood Elementary in this amazing community.

At Maplewood, safety and security are our top priorities. Please make sure to remember the following safety procedures:

- All visitors must report to the front office.
- All visitors must go through our Raptor Visitor System.
- All individuals are encouraged to wear a mask on our campus.



The Secure the Next Generation Referendum would increase voters' investment in education to one mill to continue securing funds for all public schools – and will now also include charter schools - to:



Recruit and retain high-quality teachers and eligible staff by increasing compensation supplements



Maintain and enhance school resource officers and school safety staff



Maintain and enhance essential programs, such as mental health services



- Supplements for teachers and eligible staff

Audit Approval:

The District engaged S. Davis & Associates, P.A. to audit the current, and soon to expire, Secure the Next Generation Referendum. The audit noted that the District expended Secure the Next Generation funds as approved by voters on the August 28, 2018, referendum ballot.

Why does BCPS need to renew the referendum and increase it to 1 mill?

The funds from the ½ mill referendum that voters approved in 2018 are set to expire. Those funds support over 500 school safety personnel, 100 mental health professionals, and approximately \$82 million in compensation supplements for teachers and eligible staff to compete with neighboring school districts.

The School Board voted to approve and present this referendum on the August 23, 2022, primary election ballot, with an increase to one mill, for voters to consider investing in Broward County Public Schools.

This renewal would provide BCPS with the ability to compete with neighboring school districts, and to account for new legislation that requires the District to now share nearly 20% of these funds with charter schools.

What is a mill or millage rate?

The mill or millage rate is the amount of property value used to calculate local property taxes. One mill would provide \$100 for every \$100,000 of assessed property value.

What is the Difference Between the Secure the Next Generation Referendum Renewal and the SMART Bond?

The Secure the Next Generation Referendum is not related to the SMART Bond. SMART Bond funds strictly provide funding for critical maintenance needs and capital improvements to buildings. The SMART Bond funds cannot be used for compensation or noncapital expenses. To learn more, visit bcpssmartfutures.com.

What to expect for year 2023:

- At an average home value of \$390,000, homeowners would invest approximately \$270 per year or \$23 per month, which is an additional \$11.50 more than their current investment.
- At an average condo value of \$190,000, owners would invest approximately \$150 per year or \$13 per month, which is an additional \$6.50 more than their current investment.
- If the referendum passes, it would generate \$177 million for BCPS and \$45 million for charter schools annually, a total of approximately \$227 million (includes 2% collection shortfall in property taxes) in fiscal year 2023. The referendum will expire in four years.
