Pre-K started off this school with so much excitement and joy to be back at school. Each class took time to get all the students acclimated to our new school year. We explored our classrooms, discussed school safety and focused on emotionally being ready to learn. The children have started learning the letters N, P, W and H through hands-on activities that are engaging and developmentally appropriate. We work on Social emotional learning and social skills such as sharing, taking turns and following directions daily. Remember to read to your children as often as you can.



Happy Fall, ya'll! Just like that, we are already done with Quarter 1!! Our little learners have adjusted seamlessly to "big" school by creating new friendships and experiences and are well on their way to mastering the school rules and procedures! Families, we always need your continued help and support to ensure your child's success! Please continue helping your young learner at home by using games and flash cards to practice skills; incorporating cooking and shopping into math to identify quantity, shapes, and colors is always a fun way to learn! And don't forget to read nightly together because ... READERS are LEADERS! We are looking forward to seeing our Kindergarteners grow and flourish as they enter a new Quarter!



Hi Maplewood families! Your first grader has already been working so hard this year and proving that they are Maplewood minded. As we begin the second quarter, we continue to hit the ground running with reading! Your child will be mastering "story elements" such as main idea & details and sequence of events as well as "text features" in non-fiction texts. We will dive into economics where they'll get to learn all about goods and services, saving and spending money and consumers vs producers. In math your child is learning different addition and subtraction strategies and working on fluency. We went on our first field trip to the Sawgrass Nature Center and learned all about different kinds of wildlife. Remember, we are a TEAM and always need your continued support at home. Please read with your child every night and ask those comprehension questions to keep your little learner interested in different kinds of texts. We've got a lot more to learn and we'll continue to grow in all academic and social areas!



Second grade is off to a great start. Students have been working hard in reading, we've identified how text features help us make meaning. We've talked about plot structure and story elements using robust text about habitats as well as folklores. In the area of social studies, scholars have explored maps, and spoken about the role of government. In science, we have worked on life cycles, severe weather, force. Our mathematicians have worked on even and odd numbers, as well as explored various strategies to help us ad numbers to 100. It has been a wonderful few weeks of school and our scholars are finishing the 1st quarter off happily.



We are off to a great start in third grade! We have learned all of the classroom rules and expectations. Our new Florida B.E.S.T standards in reading and math are being taught and reviewed throughout the week. We are so happy to see students getting acclimated to third grade and becoming responsible with their nightly Please reading and math homework. continue to read 20 minutes each night and check their comprehension. Students should also be striving for 50 minutes of i-Ready reading and 30 minutes of math. Please continue to practice multiplication strategies at home (arrays, equal groups, repeat addition, skip counting - especially by 2s, 5s, 10s). Stay tuned for fall conferences as teachers will be reaching out to you soon!

4THGRADE

We have busy little bees over in 4th grade land! We have hit the ground running with LOTS of new materials to implement this school year. In reading we have been digging into a variety of different text types to summarize and find the central idea using relevant details. We have learned a lot of new vocabulary words and skills that go along with our reading too! In class, we just completed our first writing piece, which was an expository essay on chipmunks. We enjoyed researching this furry friend and writing an informational essay using all that we learned. We have also been practicing our cursive and typing skills weekly! In math, we have made it through three whole topics, or chapters, which included: place value, rounding, ordering numbers, multiplication and division (up to 12's), and multi digit multiplication! In science we have been working through several fun topics. I think it's safe to say that our favorite was studying the phases of the moon and modeling each phase using Oreo cookies! Mmmmmmmm! We are really looking forward to our upcoming field trip at the end of October at the Broward Center of Performing Arts to see School House Rocks! We are ready to pick up speed as we head into quarter two!



We are extremely proud of our fifth graders and how they are progressing academically and socially. In ELA, students are focusing on different skills such as cause and effect, making mental images while they read, and exploring content vocabulary. They are also making science connections as they look closely at "Cultivating Natural Resources" such as corn. In science students are learning about weather, the water cycle, and earth's movements of revolution and rotation. Finally, in math students are diving into adding and subtracting decimals. As the quarter ends, students are beginning to multiply multi-digit numbers. The fifth-grade team looks forward to another successful quarter with our students!



Special Programs were so excited to start the 2022-2023 school year. We saw our old friend as well as welcomed new friends. We have been busy learning and start ULS (Unique Learning System). The students seem to enjoy the activities, stories, current event articles and games that we are using with the program. The students are enjoying learning about fall and are getting excited for Halloween.



The specials classes are hard at work in their respective subjects.

- In PE we are staying active and physically fit through exercise, dance, and yoga.
- In Art, primary grades are focusing on the element 'shape' by breaking down images into different shapes.
- In intermediate grades we are focusing on art techniques such as blending and shading with various materials.
- In Music we are exploring the sounds of fall and continuing our work on our steady beat skills as well as reading music, rhythms, and musical analysis.

In October, Maplewood participated in the Step Up 4 Down Syndrome Walk & 5k event which raised funds for the Broward Gold Coast Down Syndrome Organization. The Broward Gold Coast Down Syndrome Organization is where families receive support and resources. This organization is dedicated to serving families who have an individual with Down syndrome. Our school joined Team Preston and helped raise \$685.00. Our team placed 2nd for largest team with 59 members.

Social Emotional Learning



Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) helps students develop the skills necessary to identify and manage their emotions, set, and achieve goals, feel, and show empathy for others, respect diversity, create and maintain positive relationships and make safe and responsible decisions. We recognize the importance of teaching our students these life skills that are needed now and throughout adulthood. Mindfulness supports SEL as the base of awareness and is described as paying attention in the present moment. It includes being aware of one's thoughts, emotions, bodily sensations, and the surrounding environment. Practicing mindfulness promotes mental and physical well-being and resiliency.

Greetings from your School Counselor Ms. Clemmons. Our 4th and 5th grade teachers recently administered the ReThink Ed Social Emotional (SEL) Survey to their students. The survey consisted of 45 questions, designed to assess the student's social/emotional needs. The survey results will be analyzed, and feedback will be provided to all teachers. Teachers will use the data to implement daily SEL lessons, that are specific to each student's need. Students in 5th grade are also engaging in the SEL program, Riding The Waves with Ms. Shanel, who is a licensed mental health therapist. The curriculum consists of 12 short lessons that focus on identifying sources of stress and learning healthy ways of coping.

We are excited to celebrate the upcoming festivities during the week of October 24th-31st for Red Ribbon Week. Red Ribbon Week is recognized districtwide. The goal is to educate students about the negative impact of drug abuse and to influence students to continue to maintain a drug free lifestyle. There are many new student engagement opportunities beginning at Maplewood. The following clubs are scheduled to begin the week of October 24th: Cooking, Art, Chorus, Fitness, Robotics, Debate, Safety Patrol, WOWL, Play Pals, Gameday and Peace Club. In addition to the exciting club activities, Maplewood students are also participating in 2 charity donation drives. The first one is Harvest drive, food donations will be given to local families in need. Collections will continue until November 10th. The second drive is The Hurricane Ian Relief collection. Students schoolwide have been asked to donate spare change to contribute to the Peace Club initiative. The funds will be collected until the end of October. All proceeds will be sent to our fellow FL residents (west coast) who were victims of the hurricane lan. There is an incentive for the grade level who collects the most money. They will receive a special reward.

How can I help my child get the most out of i-Ready Diagnostic and Instruction?

i-Ready Diagnostic and Instruction is an online, interactive learning environment designed to assess students and then provide individualized instruction based on each student's unique needs.

- Talk with your child about how practicing i-Ready Diagnostic and Instruction at home
 will help prepare for classwork. Also, explain that i-Ready Diagnostic and Instruction
 will show teachers where your child is doing well, and which topics need some more
 review.
- Encourage your child to use the tools provided during lessons and to use scrap paper for math computation.
- Students should practice reading and math at least 50 minutes per week which should be broken up into 10-15 minutes per day
