Pre-K News

This month our Pre-K students have been working on following directions and increasing the number of directions they follow. They have been working hard on sharing and taking turns as well as learning their new letters each week. Their math skills have increased as they learn to match quantities and recognize numbers up to 20. Our Pre K students continue to work hard on their skills to prepare them for kindergarten.

Kindergarten News

As we enter our last quarter of Kindergarten we will be preparing our students for a smooth transition to First grade. Students have been working all year to become better readers, writers, and develop a love for learning! As we close the year, students will be learning about landforms, plants, and geometry (2D and 3D shapes). Thanks for all your support this year.

First Grade News

First grade has had an amazing April at Maplewood! We started off the month getting back into our daily routine after a restful spring break. We were able to let our creative juices flow through our paragraph writing! We are really getting good at adding and subtracting two-digit numbers and will finish the year working on measurement, data, and geometry. We have integrated science and social studies into our read-alouds to aid comprehension. All of the students have continued working hard in the classroom on phonics, American history, and Earth science. We are looking forward to marvelous May and joyful June's events such as a field trip to watch a play about Pete the Cat and the first grade awards ceremony!

Second Grade News

We are nearing the end of this academic school year! Where has the time gone? We have just a few more second grade skills to cover before we send our students off into the third grade world. In reading, students are now learning how to describe how an author uses reasons to support specific points in a text. Soon we will also be practicing answering test-style questions to better prepare our students for the Primary End of Year Reading Test.

In math we are finishing up length in metric units, and will move on to graphing and geometry. In science, we will be learning about force and motion, and experimenting with magnets.

Third Grade News

WOW! 4th quarter! 3rd grade recently took the ELA FSA. As a team we are so proud of how hard our students worked to prepare for and complete the FSA. One down, one to go! Please be sure your child is reading for 25 minutes each night and completing their homework.

As we prepare for the math FSA we will be working on cumulative reviews, covering multiple standards daily. The students will be using many manipulatives, and strategies to master these standards! We will also be working on math fact fluency: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Reflex is a wonderful resource as well as flash cards! Math FSA is approaching. We will be testing on May 7th and 8th. The third grade team is working hard to be sure the lessons that we are teaching are rigorous enough for our students to be well prepared to take the math FSA. Also, we are continuing to build confidence within our students by encouraging them daily to do their very best.

Fifth Grade News

Fifth grade is getting deep into our FCAT Science, FSA Math and FSA Reading crunch time! The students are working very hard and are making tremendous gains. We began the 4th quarter with the FSA Writing test and the students and teachers feel confident that they did their best. A few important dates for 5th grade...We will be having a 5th Grade End of Year Celebration Meeting on Thursday, April 11th and May 16th beginning at 6:00pm. We will also be having another Pajama Bash on Thursday, April 18th from 6:00pm-8:00pm, which will be our last nighttime fundraiser, so if you are able to volunteer, we would appreciate it. Fourth Grade News

In Science we are exploring Earth's Movement, Effects of Space Exploration, and Experimenting with Forces. In Math we are adding and subtracting decimals, working on order of operations and coordinate grids. In Reading, students will be working on comprehension strategies for literary and informational text.

They will work towards providing support from the text for inferences and points that are explicitly stated. Students will also continue working on vocabulary skills and

Preventing Youth Suicide: Tips for Parents and Educators

Suicide is preventable. Youth who are contemplating suicide frequently give warning signs. Do not be afraid to ask about suicidal thoughts. Never take warning signs lightly or promise to keep them secret.

Literacy Corner

Reading stamina is a child's ability to focus and read independently for longer periods of time without being distracted or without distracting others. Reading stamina is something that parents can help students develop. Here's how:

- 1. Vary the way the reading is done. Think about this in terms of having your child "read to himself, read to someone, and listen to reading." Some combination of the three should make up the reading time, especially for new or struggling readers.
- 2. Choose "just right" books. If your child is at a stage of being able to read alone, help him/her choose books that they are able to read independently. This means they should be able to decode almost every word in the book correctly.
- 3. Set reasonable goals. When starting out, limit book time to just a few minutes and work up from there. For elementary aged readers, consider starting with 10-15 minutes.
