## CCPRE-K NEWS

Pre- K has been participating in exciting and engaging lessons all quarter long. We have been focusing on our "All About Me" unit, learning procedures and routines, exploring our 5 senses, and learning our letters. Our classes have been working on letters such as M, N, and H, and using these letters while participating in fun and interactive activities that facilitate learning, growth, and play! We have been using language to make observations, role play, and participate in "show and tell'. Coming up in October is Swim Central and we are excited to spend time at the pool learning swim safety skills!

### FIRST GRADE NEWS

First grade has had an optimistic October at Maplewood! We started off the month with getting a new first grade teacher, Ms. Abelard, who we love already! The new students were able to meet her and get started working on reading, writing, math, science, and social studies standards right away! We are really getting good at determining the difference between rules and laws as well as rights and responsibilities. We have been integrating science and social studies into our read-alouds to aid comprehension. All of the students have continued working hard in the classroom on phonics, vocabulary acquisition, addition and subtraction strategies, and the basic needs of living and nonliving things. We had a wonderful time at the fall parade and loved seeing everyone's creative costumes. We are looking forward to November's fall events and a restful Thanksgiving break.

## KINDERGARTEN NEWS

Fall is officially here! Our Kindergarteners are off to a great start! We are learning about our five senses, how to ask and answer questions when reading, drawing pictures to tell stories, and identifying and counting numbers up to 9. Our first field trip is coming up on November 1st to see the play, "Miss Nelson Takes a Field Trip." We are looking forward to all the fall fun activities this month. Parents remember to read each night for at least 15 minutes. That includes: reading to you, you reading to them, and/or being read to in any language.

### SECOND GRADE NEWS

Second grade students have been working hard in all areas of learning. In reading we have practiced various skills such as asking and answering questions, recounting stories, determining the main idea, identifying character response, and now making science and social studies connections in a text. In math we are finishing up place value concepts. This will prepare our students for 2-digit and 3-digit addition and subtraction. In science we are learning about the scientific process, weather patterns, and basic needs of plants and animals. Finally, in social studies students are learning about different types of maps and their elements.

We are starting off the second quarter with a field trip! On October 22<sup>nd</sup> we will be seeing the play, "Showtime with Shakespeare and The Magic Treehouse" at the Coral Springs Center for the Arts. This hip-hop musical is based on one of the stories from The Magic Treehouse chapter books. The main characters from the series meet Shakespeare and learn about 16th century England. The Magic Treehouse books are always informative and exciting, and the play introduces students to Shakespeare, rhyming, and literature through fun, music, and dancing.

Please make sure your child is reading at least 20 minutes a day and is using our computer programs at home. Students have access to Reflex, Think Central, Spelling City, Learning A to Z, etc. on Clever.

# THIRD GRADE NEWS

Our students have been working hard adjusting to third grade standards and procedures! We are starting off the second quarter focusing on various comprehensive strategies (going back into the passage and underlining where we find our answers). Our third graders will learn to dig deeper, to fully understand the passage that they are reading. We will be focusing on point of view, using fiction and non-fiction text, text features of a non-fiction text, we will also begin comparing two passages. In math, we will be working on word problems and using strategies to solve them. The students will have to determine which operation to use to solve the word problem (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division) using their strategies. We will also be working on rounding and fractions this quarter.

Please be sure that your child is reading for 20-25 minutes each night and comes to school prepared to take accelerated reader tests! Also, please continue working on math fact fluency with your child! Thank you for all that you do!

Special Programs has started off the school year school assessing students for their current skills and levels and teaching them our classroom rules and procedures. Students have been introduced to the curriculum and have all been transitioning well and working hard to master state access points, often through real-life examples. We are very excited about all the great things to come this school year and look forward to seeing your child's progress. ## FOURTH GRADE NEWS

In reading we have been working on finding the main idea of a text and summarizing it. We are also referring to details in a text in order to draw inferences. While in Social Studies the students been examining physical features of Florida and looking at the contributions of significant individuals in Florida. During math we have been representing and solving multiplication problems using multiple strategies such as area models, partial products, and even lattice multiplication. Finally in Science students explored the three types of rocks: sedimentary, igneous, and metamorphic as well as the properties of minerals including color, luster, hardness, and streak.

### FIFTH GRADE NEWS

In math our fifth graders have wrapped up their units on division and are moving on to understanding how to add and subtract decimals. This will be a handy skill to use in their checkbooks for JA Biztown coming next month! Our little scientists have completed the water cycle, weather and climate, and earth's position in the solar system. Mrs. Marcello and Mr. Culbertson are guiding our young learners through hands on activities and projects to deepen the understanding of science content. In reading our 5th graders have accepted the 10 Book Challenge. Mrs.Kirk and Mrs. Earhardt have challenged students to read books from a wide range of genres as they continue on their reading quests. To get the students ready for Document Based Questioning (DBQ), Social Studies has begun with a unit on Jamestown in which our students have been analyzing a series of documents to see what life was like for the first English Settlers in America. 5<sup>th</sup> grade is off and running to a fruitful school year!

# GUIDANCE NEWS

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process in which students can recognize and manage emotions, solve problems effectively and establish positive relationships with others. SEL provides instruction in skills that enable students to be successful in all areas of their lives; using a variety of resources and the Harmony Program which aligns with Broward County SEL standards

Research indicates that students involved in SEL programming experience significantly greater academic achievement, greater motivation to learn, a deeper commitment to school, better classroom behavior and improved attendance. Reports of student depression, anxiety and stress significantly decreased as well!
