WHAT IS STUDENT COUNCIL?

Student council is a student representative organization made up of 3rd through 5th grade students. These students serve as the voice of the student body. They help share ideas, interests, and concerns with teachers and administrators. Student council representatives help with school-wide activities such as fundraising, social events, and community service. Student council members also engage in activities centered on leadership development, government, and democracy.

• MEMEBERSHIP

Student Council is comprised of two student representatives from each third, fourth and fifth grade class. Elections will take place in September of each school year. Each classroom will elect two representatives.

Fifth grade students may also run for the following officer positions: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian.

Student Council representatives and officers are looked upon as role models. They are expected to adhere to the life long guidelines and life skills that are infused throughout our Leadership curriculum at all times.

Student Council representatives are expected to attend all monthly morning meetings. Any student missing more than 3 meetings will not be able to serve in their representative capacity.

• MEETINGS

Meetings are generally held once the <u>first Thursday of the month at</u> 7:30AM. Sometimes an additional "special event" meeting will need to be held in addition to the first Thursday meeting. In those instances, a message will be sent home with students and a reminder will be made on the morning announcements.

• PROJECTS

At Eagle Point Elementary, giving back to the community is an important part of our education. Student Council sets the bar for excellence as they assist with school-wide events, charity fundraising, and giving back to the community. Some of the projects Student Council participates in are:

November: Student Council sponsors Harvest Drive, а food items collectina and for а local Food Bank. **December:** Student Council sponsors a toy drive collecting toys for the Make A Wish Child Net program.

January- May: Students participated in and raised funds for various organizations.
