 \cdot Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.

 \cdot Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, song books, poems, and information books.

· Listen to your child read, daily.

 \cdot Be a "reading model" for your child. Let your child see you reading magazines, newspapers, and books.

 \cdot Schedule regular trips to the library.

 \cdot Talk with your child frequently so that he/she will connect the spoken with the written word.

Hello Caregivers!

As the school year ends, I want to let you know that I have enjoyed working with you and your students, and I want to thank all of you for a great year. Through the transition to online learning, many of us have struggled with balancing the demands of home, school and work simultaneously. I encourage you to routinely schedule and prioritize time for your child's, as well as your own, self-care. Self-care involves taking an active role in maintaining

your physical and psychological health and well-being. If you have not done so already, you may access my canvas course (all students received an invitation) in order to discover (or re-discover) mind-body skills related to breathwork, mindfulness, artwork, music and movement. I will plan to leave the course practices open throughout the summer. You may also access the resources section for any relevant family or community needs.

For those of you with rising middle schoolers, I recommend you plan a family meeting to discuss any excitement, fears, rumors or expectations they/ you might have about the upcoming transition. Many middle schools have traditionally held open-house or orientation days throughout the summer. These visits are designed to ease your child's adjustment and are helpful for addressing any questions or concerns prior to the start of school. Due to the ongoing restrictions on social gatherings, it is likely that many of these opportunities will be provided virtually and/or later in the summer.
