I cannot believe that our school year has halfway come and gone. Our major focus continues to be on fundamental skills and meeting each child's individual needs. Everyday students are reviewing and enriching on the standards and skills they need to be successful.

Now that PM2 and the iReady diagnostic 2 has been completed, we have a wealth of data to review and use strategically to plan next steps for instruction. I am confident that if we work strategically, our students will exceed all our expectations. Our 5th grade students took part 1 of the Science midyear assessment. The results of these tests will help us in driving our instruction and the creation of action plans as we rethink crunch time to ensure ALL students are striving to be their BEST at meeting mastery of grade level standards. We also continue WIDA testing, which is part of the calculations for the school overall federal index grade (more information on this topic, log onto FLDOE.org).

Don't forget to schedule a conference with your child's teacher. Make sure you've had at least 2 conferences with your child's teacher. During the conference teachers will be sharing information about retention and/or promotion to the next grade level. Stay up to date with school information by listening to and reading parentlinks emails and text messages, it's our way of communicating with you. Mark your calendar! Benefits of a Bilingual Brain

Being bilingual has many brain benefits! People who speak more than one language have improved cognitive skills, better memories, better attention spans and can multitask better than people who only speak one language.

Bilingual Kids Do Not Get Confused Speaking Two Languages

Some parents of bilingual children worry when they hear statements that are **not true** such as: "Bilingual kids get confused learning two languages at once. It is impossible for children to learn a second language while trying to master their first".

Parents should speak one language to their child, and it should be the community language so that eventually when their kids go to school they won't get confused.

While bilingual kids develop their language abilities differently, bilingualism does not cause confusion. Learning two or even three languages at once does not cause confusion.

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Reading Information

Your child may be eligible for free books through New Worlds Reading, Florida's FREE book delivery program. New Worlds Reading mails free books and activities to eligible children to help strengthen their literacy skills, build reading confidence, and nurture a lifelong love of reading. Once enrolled, students will automatically receive free books and resources through fifth grade, even if their reading scores improve.

New Worlds Reading is administered by the University of Florida Lastinger Center for Learning, which has selected Scholastic as a partner. Books are selected in collaboration with the Florida Department of Education, with materials available in English, Spanish, Haitian Creole or braille. This is an incredible opportunity to help your child build a free personalized at-home library and foster a love for reading in your home.

To be eligible, a child must be in VPK and not yet meeting age-appropriate standards according to FAST Star Early Literacy or in K-5th grade and not yet reading on grade level in a public or charter school. Apply for your child today by visiting newworldsreading.com/enroll.

Encourage Your Child to Give Explanations

- When your child is trying to solve a problem, ask what he or she is thinking. If your child seems puzzled, ask him or her to tell you what doesn't make sense. (Talking about their ideas and how they reach solutions helps children learn to reason mathematically.)
- Suggest that your child act out a problem to solve it. Have your child show how he or she reached a conclusion by drawing pictures and moving objects as well as by using words.
- Treat errors as opportunities to help your child learn something new.

Thinking Maps Home & School Connection

Cypress is a Thinking Map school. Thinking Maps is a set of 8 visual patterns that correlate to specific cognitive processes. They are used across all grades and content areas to build the critical thinking, problem-solving, comprehension, and communication skills necessary for academic success in every domain. Students will be using Brace Maps and Multi-Flow maps in February and March.





Multi-Flow Map Cause and Effect


> Additional ideas for using the Multi-Flow Map:

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
